DeShazo, County Treasurer for the year ending the 31st 1873 and find the same to be correct leaving a balance of cash in his hands at that date of \$1,856.⁹⁸ -

The Total cash receipts during the year were \$53,204.¹² and the amount paid out according to the vouchers presented and allowed by your committee was \$51,347.¹⁹ and annexed hereto is a statement in detail showing the sources from whence the money received was derived and for what purpose the same was paid out.

We have deducted from the money apparently received by the Treasurer the sum of \$4,435.⁰³ due from the Marquette and Pacific Rolling Mill Company which appeared as cash but in reality never was received by the Treasurer and the same is charged to the company aforesaid in the suspense account.

Your Committee in examining into the amount received by the Treasurer were obliged to depend solely on his books - We are surprised to find that no provision of law exists for keeping account of the moneys received by him yearly -

Justices of the Peace townships treasurers and the state treasurer are required by law to pay to the County Treasurer the amounts to which the County may be entitled but no provision is made for giving a statement of such amounts to the County clerk who we think ought by law be required to charge the Treasurer with all moneys received by him the same as township clerks are now required by law to charge township treasurers but no such provision exists

We also find that under the present system of returning delinquent taxes to the office of the Auditor General the State this past year has virtually taken \$3,447.⁴⁵ from the County by charging the County directly the sum of \$2,803.³² for lands bid into the State in Oct 1873 and deducting the same from the specific taxes to which we are entitled and the further sum of \$944.¹³ on the five year lands all of which would have been saved to the County if each county was allowed to sell its own delinquent lands and pay the State directly the State tax instead of returning the lands to the Auditor General to be again sent back by him to the County Treasurer -
