In the matter of the application of J B Wasley, Jos Giel, Wm Rickard, John Kung, John Thomas, Georg Dukey, Henry Harroy, Charles Champion, Simon Niemann, John C Van Dyke, Georg McAllister, R D McKay and W J Giel, for the division of the township of Michiganumme by detaching certain territory therefrom, and for the erection, and organization of a new township, to consist of the territory so detached,

It appearing to the board of Supervisors that application has been made, and that notice thereof has been signed posted up and published, as in the manner required by law; and having duly considered the matter of said application, the board order and enact that the territory described in said application, to wit: Townships forty nine (49) fifty (50) fifty one (51) and fifty two (52) North, of Range twenty eight (28) west, Township forty eight (48) and the east half of Townships forty nine (49) north of Range twenty nine (29) west, be and the same is hereby detached from the township of Michiganumme, and that the said territory so detached as aforesaid be and the same is hereby erected into a township to be called and known by the name of the township of Champion,

The first annual township meeting thereof shall be held at Champion Hall (so called) in said new township, on Tuesday, the fifth day of November A.D. 1878, at 9 o'clock in the forenoon, and at said meeting George Derringer, John Minnis and R D McKay, three electors of said Township, shall be the persons whose duty it shall be to preside at such meeting, appoint a clerk, open and keep the polls, and exercise the same powers as the inspectors of election at any township meeting, as the law provides,

In accordance with request, I submit an appendix to my annual report (as Judge of Probate) of insane persons at Kalamazoo, a charge to Marquette County, with a provision for relief, for your consideration and action, if compatible.

Whereas, Under the provision of Act 194 of public acts 1877. all patients whose expenses shall have been paid by any county for two years

continuously, such patients shall thereafter upon the proper certificates be maintained by the State on and after the 1st day of January next, to wit, 1879, and at the close of each succeeding quarter thereafter, all of two years duration.

And it further provides for relief for patients whose parents have gained a residence in other countries or states, and

Whereas, The following named persons, to wit; Mary Schwartz, Peter Connor, Lizzie Tappendorf, Frank Price, Xavier Roth, Christian Wahl, Lesine Charter, Catherine O'Brien, Michael McNameara and Invaule Marquette, have been inmates of the asylum for the required period, and Louis Geroux, on April 1st, 1879, will then have been the required period to become a State charge, and

Whereas, The following named persons, to wit; Ephraim Marrs and William J McDonald, minors, may be removed to their parents by paying the necessary transportation, thus making a further saving to the County, thereby leaving after January 1st, 1879, only two patients at the asylum as a County charge; now, therefore,

Resolved, That the Judge of Probate of this County be and he is hereby authorized and empowered to see the said transfers are regularly made, and also that he be authorized to attend to the removal of any and all patients when he can legally and consistently do so; and further, if from any cause it should become a necessity for him to proceed to Kalamazoo, in perfecting the same, he do so; and that he keep this Board advised of his doings in the premises, and it is further

Resolved, That if it be found necessary to use money for transportation purposes, that the County Treasurer be, and he hereby is instructed to advance such amounts as may be necessary to carry out the same.

Whereas: It is believed that a law could be so framed as only to tax property to persons owning the same, and also enable the assessing officers to reach a large amount of monies and credits that now escape taxation

Therefore be it Resolved - By the board of supervisors of the County of Barry, that the Hon. the Legislature of the State of Michigan be, and is hereby petitioned to enact a law providing:

1st. That a mortgage on real estate be assessed to the mortgagor and the value over and above the mortgage to the occupant.

2nd. That personal property shall be exempt from taxation to the amount of indebtedness of the person possessing the same, other than debts secured by mortgage on real estate.

3rd. All monies and credits to be assessed as personal property except when secured by mortgage on real estate and

4th. That the occupant of any real estate mortgaged be required to pay the tax assessed to mortgagor, and the collector's receipt therefor shall be so much money paid on said mortgage

Resolved, That the above preamble and resolutions be signed

by the Chairman ^{and} clerk, and the Chairman caused to be printed ^{and}
transmit to the clerk of each County in the State one copy, requesting
that they be laid before their several boards of superiors, respectfully
asking their concurrence in petitioning the legislature to enact the

The following communication was received, read and on motion of Supervisor P. Parsons, referred to a special committee of the Board:

To the Chairman and Board of Supervisors  
of Montgomery County

Gentlemen: There is a Mrs. Clausen a resident of Cardaburg, who has been an invalid for some time, and also a county charge. Several medical men of the county have treated her - one from Montgomery - which was paid out of the county poor fund. I took charge of the Humboldt and Edwards mines in November, and was told this woman was a county patient, and had not to be treated as a mining case. Although her husband was working off and on in the Humboldt mine, he could not make enough to support his family, being forced to leave time to nurse his invalid wife.

I took hold of the case through humanity only, without any recompense for my services from the county, the superintendent of poor agreeing to furnish medicines. He continued to do so, paying as much as fourteen dollars per month to Mr. Schaller, our druggist here at the time, until April. I had private reasons to withdraw my prescriptions from Mr. Schaller. Mr. Strom then notified me I had to continue to get my medicines from him, although I proposed to furnish them cheaper than he was doing at cost.

Mr. Strom, for prejudicial reasons, would not allow me to furnish any. Mr. Schaller has moved away since then from Humboldt.

Mr. Strom comes and notifies me he will furnish no more medicines. The patient is improving, so much so that when I took hold of her she had to be lifted when wanting to move; now she can sit up all day, and do considerable work. This woman still requires medical and surgical treatment, and as the superintendent has refused to furnish medicines, etc., I am forced to give up the further care of the case. The woman will suffer, and her husband is too poor to pay for medicines and medical attendance.

All the above facts can be substantiated by competent testimony. I remain yours,

I wish to call your attention to the matter of my  
salary as Judge of Probate. The Supreme Court has recently  
made a decision in regard to the salaries of Judges of Probate  
under which I am entitled to that portion of my salary which  
was ordered by the board of Supervisors. During the first two  
years that I held the office the board allowed only \$500 per  
annum, which was an average \$500 per year less than I  
was legally entitled to. The board afterwards increased my  
salary to \$1,500 per annum which I received for two years. This  
was then cut down to \$1,200, and afterwards to \$1,000, and again  
increased to \$1,100, at which it now stands.

I have now acquiesced in the reduction made in my  
salary, and now rely on your honorable body ultimately doing  
me justice in the matter.

The Supreme Court having now decided that the salary  
of the Probate Judge being fixed cannot be diminished during  
his term of office, I now earnestly request your honorable body  
to investigate the matter and give due effect to the law.

I claim that I am entitled to at least \$1,000 additional du-  
ring the two years that I received only \$500 per year, and further  
that I am entitled to the amount deducted from my salary from  
the time it was fixed at \$1,500.

The duties of the office are very important, and in the  
language of the Supreme Court, one of the most important  
branches of our judicial system. There are no fees to

Reports of Committees

By the special committee appointed to investigate certain charges against Mr. Edwin Stern, superintendent of the poor. To the Chairman and Board of Supervisors of Montgomery County, Gentlemen.

Your Committee, to whom was referred the communication of James M. Quillan, have investigated the charges therein contained against Edwin Stern, the superintendent of the poor of the Third district, and have found the following facts relative thereto:

1st James M. Quillan was employed as mining physician at Humboldt and Edwards mines November 1st, 1878. and is yet so employed.

2nd The men employed at these mines pay the mining physician a monthly medical fee for which said physician furnishes to said men and their families medicines and medical attendance.

3rd Christ Clauson is one of the men employed at the Humboldt mines, and he has paid his medical fee each month from the 1st of November, 1878, to the 1st of June 1879, and he is willing to continue to pay it.

4th Mrs. Clauson, the invalid mentioned in James M. Quillan's communication, has been sick for some time and has been attended by Dr. M. Quillan since he became mining physician at Humboldt and Edwards mines. Dr. M. Quillan receives no compensation for his attendance to said invalid but the monthly medical fee paid by her husband.

5th The superintendent of the poor supplied medicines for said invalid for some time back and up to the first of May 1879. His reasons for discontinuing to supply medicines any longer are First: that Clauson is not in want of relief from the County.

Secondly: that it was really no benefit to Clauson for the superintendent to furnish medicines for his wife.

Thirdly: that it is his object and duty to curtail relief to the poor when no want or suffering is occasioned, and that in this instance he was actuated by no other motive than a desire to lessen the expenditures of the poor fund.

It is the opinion of your Committee that the superintendent of the poor was justified in the course he took. All of which your Committee respectfully reports, asking for a decision of the full board upon the matter and your Committee ask to be discharged from further consideration of this subject. - James Pascoe, Michael Bruson, Thomas J. Dandow } Committee

You will observe that the average number maintained the past year is less than the year previous, and that while the total cost of maintenance is slightly less than in 1878, the average cost is somewhat greater. It should be remembered that certain items of expense, as keepers salary, fuel etc. remain the same though the number of inmates may vary somewhat and this alone, with a less number of inmates, to increase the average cost.

The stock kept at present consists of one (1) horse, two (2) cows, five (5) pigs and thirty (30) fowls

The improvements during the year consisted only of an addition to the barn made necessary by an increase average of hay for building which bids was received and the amount made to the lowest bidder. The addition made was 16 x 16, 14 feet posts, and a beam to 12 x 16, in which to house mays and slights, boarded and battened, with shingle roof and the entire cost as shown elsewhere, was thirty (30) dollars.

From the foregoing you observe that the total redemption in the amount expended in giving temporary relief as compared with 1878 was \$1,656<sup>95</sup>/<sub>100</sub> - about 6 1/2 per cent; that the decrease in the first district was \$1,810<sup>53</sup>/<sub>100</sub>, about 35 per cent; in the second district - \$102<sup>24</sup>/<sub>100</sub>, about 1 per cent, while in the third district the increase was \$556<sup>82</sup>/<sub>100</sub>, about 11 per cent.

There was a decrease of forty seven (47) in the total number of persons relieved, and of forty eight (48) cents in the average amount given to each person.

From the woods late purchased by your board in January last 301 cords of wood, about one third of which was hard wood was taken last winter at a cost - piled up at the poor house - of \$1.49 per cord; adding the stampage paid by you, makes the entire cost \$1.89 per cord. Not only is this a much less price than the wood could have been bought for, but the chopping was done principally by persons who, but for the employment thus given would have required aid from the County. Of the amount of wood above stated there is remaining on hand 150 cords; the cost of chopping and hauling, which is in the foregoing statement charged to the poor house and first district, if admitted from their accounts



they would be reduced to \$45 and \$180. respectively. Accompanying this report are all bills paid by this board during the year, which you will find to be full and complete vouchers for its entire expenditures.

Your Committee on County officers accounts to whom was referred the reports of the superintendents of the poor, would respectfully say that they have carefully considered the same and conclude that the items of medical attendance \$1,692.<sup>24</sup>/<sub>100</sub>; Medicines, \$1,779.03 - making a total of \$3,471.<sup>27</sup>/<sub>100</sub> - can in the future, be materially decreased if a judicious system of contracting in each district with responsible physicians be entered into.

Your Committee would recommend that a committee of three be appointed to confer with the superintendents of the poor with a view of ascertaining what price each district can be cured for, including medicines by the lowest responsible bidder in



each district said Committee to report to this board at its next meeting. You will notice by the monthly reports of the superintendents of the poor, filed with the County Clerk, that an effort is being made successfully to effect a decrease in the expenditures for the temporary relief and your Committee trusts that this decrease may continue in the future.

Having had under consideration the communication of Hon. Edmund S. Hardy, Judge of Probate, presented at the last meeting of your honorable board, and by your reference to me for my opinion thereon, I beg leave to report that the Supreme Court has decided that the Board of Supervisors have no power to alter or change the salary of the Judge of Probate whom once they have fixed and established it, and that it must remain as established at the time of election.

The Court say: "If they can do anything in the matter, it is only to exercise the delegated power of acting once, until directed by the legislature to act again." This delegated power was conferred by the law of 1873. When therefore the board of Supervisors had acted once under that law they had no power to act again, without a new delegation of power by the legislature. It follows that the action of the board in fixing the salary of Judge of Probate at \$1100. from January 1<sup>st</sup> 1879, was illegal and void.
