Your special committee on Contagious

diseases beg to recommend that Dr. E. W. Flynn, of Marquette, be employed to act as County Physician for the care of Contagious malignant and infectious diseases dangerous to the Public health, under the provisions and to comply with Act No. 469 of the Local Acts of 1903, until the first day of May, 1904, at a salary of fifty dollars per month; such appointment to be made at once and to take effect whenever proper acceptance of same is filed with the County Clerk.

Your Committee further recommend the adoption of Rules for the guidance of such physician and others having the care of such diseases, and therefore your committee present and recommend the adoption of the following resolution:

Resolved: That Dr. E. W. Flynn, of Marquette, be employed to act as County physician for the care of Contagious, malignant and infectious diseases, dangerous to the Public health, under the provisions of and to comply with Act No. 469 of the Local Acts of Michigan of the year 1903, until the first day of May, 1904, and until his successor is appointed and qualified, at a salary of fifty dollars per month, such appointment to take effect on the filing of acceptance of the same with the County Clerk.

Further Resolved: That the following rules and regulations for the government of the County physician and all other persons having the care of Contagious, malignant and infectious diseases, be, and the same are hereby, promulgated and adopted.

Rules and Regulations relative to Contagious Diseases, Marquette County.

1= The County physician shall attend to and supervise the treatment of Contagious diseases, such services shall be rendered and performed under and according to the Rules and regulations of this board relative to contagious diseases, which rules and regulations and all other reasonable requirements with reference thereto of said board, shall be understood to be and are hereby declared to be binding on such County physician.

2= In all cases of epidemical contagious diseases, dangerous to the Public health, where services are performed, for which claims are to be made against the County and presented to this board for allowances, the County physician shall assume control and care of the treatment of such cases except as herein otherwise provided.

3= When a suspected case has been determined to be a contagious disease, dangerous to the public health, if such County physician and a supervisor of the Township in which such case shall be, shall in their judgment deem it necessary for the preservation of the public health, or to prevent a spread of the disease, to employ any person to do any act or thing with reference to such case, excepting those acts or things required for treating the case, they shall have and are empowered and authorized to cause such act or thing to be done, and shall keep a record of the persons employed, the time when their service shall begin, when discharged, the nature and the terms and conditions of such employment, and report the same to this board at its first session thereafter.

4= When two or more persons in any City or Township are infected with a contagious disease, dangerous to the public health, for which the expense of the treatment and care thereof shall become a public charge, the County physician is required, as speedily as possible, to remove such persons to a separate house, as provided by law (442 C.L. 1897), that all such cases may be effectually and economically treated and cared for, whenever such removal shall be deemed for the best interests of the public: Provided, that such person or persons shall not be removed to any location against the express will of any Common Council or Township board of any City or Township.

5= When any infected article shall be destroyed by any County physician, he is required to make an inventory of such articles and to appraise each thereof at its cash value, should he be unable to make such appraisement, he may employ one disinterested, competent person to assist him in such appraisement, who shall be paid two dollars a per day, which appraisement shall be signed and sworn to by the persons making it, and filed with this board.

6= Any claim against the County, presented to this board for allowance, for services performed and rendered by order and under the direction of a County physician and supervisor, shall have attached thereto, before it will be considered by this board, an affidavit (which will be furnished in blank by the County Clerk), signed by the person presenting the claim, and attested by the County physician and Supervisor, under

whose direction the services were performed, stating substantially the amount claimed and the name of the claimant, that said claim is for services actually performed and rendered, stating the kind and nature of such services, is properly itemized, that each item was necessary and the amount thereof is fair, reasonable just and that such services were necessary for the safety of the inhabitants or to prevent an epidemic of the disease; that the person to whom such services were rendered, his parents or other persons liable for his support, as the case may be, are (or are not) of sufficient ability to pay for such services. Should the claim be for infected articles destroyed, such certificate shall, in the same manner, show that it was by such county physician deemed necessary for the preservation of the public health, or for the purpose of preventing further infection. All such certificates shall also show that no part of the compensation claimed has been paid excepting as shown in the bill of account presented; that there are no legal set-offs thereto or reductions to be made therefrom, and that such services have not been certified to for any other person. If any such claim has been assigned, it must be accompanied by proof thereof, showing the name of the assignee.

7- Whenever two or more cases of any contagious disease, dangerous to the public health, shall exist in the same building or household, and one taken charge of by the county physician, he is required to have all such cases nursed, guarded and cared for by one person, if practicable, and such nursing, guarding and care is by such physician deemed necessary for the preservation of the public health, such necessity however, to be determined as herein provided.

8- Whenever any person shall be infected with any contagious disease dangerous to the public health, who shall not be of sufficient ability to provide himself with the common necessities of life, and whose persons, chargeable with his support shall neglect or refuse, or shall not be financially able to support and maintain him or to furnish him with such necessities, or if any person who shall be under quarantine, of sufficient ability to provide himself with such necessities, shall refuse to furnish or cause himself to be furnished therewith, the physician is required and it shall be his duty to report such facts to the superintendent of the Poor

of the district in which such infected person shall be, and it shall be the duty of such Superintendent of the poor to forthwith provide such persons with such necessaries, as provided by law for care of indigent persons.

9- The County physician may employ such professional or other assistance as may be necessary from time to time to effectually care for all cases coming under his supervision.

10- Nothing herein contained relating to any contagious disease dangerous to the public health shall be construed to prevent any person from employing any physician or person at his own expense to treat or care for any case of any contagious disease, subject, however, to the police regulations.

11- It shall be the duty of the Clerk of this board to transmit or cause to be transmitted to the County physician, Supervisor, Superintendent of the poor and boards of health within the County, a copy of the foregoing rules and regulations, he shall also on or about the first day of May, annually, transmit or cause to be transmitted to such persons and boards, copies of such rules, regulations, and resolutions as have been or may hereafter be adopted by this board, relative to the care and treatment and services performed in cases of such contagious diseases.

12- All rules, regulations and resolutions, or parts thereof, in conflict with the foregoing rules and regulations are hereby repealed.
