STOLE FROM THE STARVING. Erik Saarikoski Jailed for Stealing \$75 Intended for Finnish Famine Sufferers. MARY HALL'S MARITAL MISERIES HAVE BEGUN EARLY. Ten Township Tickets in the Field at Houghton-Portage Lake Boiling With Politics.

RED JACKET. Erik Saarikoski was brought before Justice Sowden Wednesday afternoon charged with embezzlement. Erik is a Finn who has been here about six months. He took part in two entertainments given for his famine-stricken countrymen in Finland and was appointed treasurer of the relief fund.

HANCOCK. At a caucus held on the quiet Tuesday evening a third ticket was nominated and placed in the hands of the township clerk before he retired. It is to be known as the People's ticket and is as follows: Supervisor, A. J. Scott; clerk, M. Finn; treasurer, Patrick S. Meehan; school inspector, G. W. Rusison; member board of review, John E. Hocking; justice of the peace, H. Drieler, Jr.; highway commissioner, Jno. R. Zuercher; overseer highways, Stephen Lee; constables, Jos. Malherbe, Jacob Rentenbach, Louis Mausewirth, Nels Burkanan.

Morales' big camp on the Otter has suspended operations and the men are arriving here daily. He employed about seventy-five men in this camp and has a big cut.

F. S. Burgess of Marquette and R. C. Williams of L'Anse were in town yesterday. The township board met Tuesday afternoon, settled with the treasurer, cancelled all orders and adjourned until today.

Houghton. The following services will be held in Trinity church between now and Easter Sunday: Good Friday, morning services at 11 a. m.; commemoration service from 12 to 3 p. m. Holy Saturday, evening and administration of baptism at 7:30 p. m. Easter day, first celebration of holy eucharist at 8 a. m.; morning prayer at 9:30 a. m.; high celebration at 10:30 a. m.; evensong with an address to the Sunday school children by a layman at 5 p. m.

Tuesday evening three more caucuses were held and as many more tickets were placed in the field, making ten in all up to date. As it now stands Fox and Sheldon are on five each for supervisor; for clerk, Brandt is on seven and Nicholas Miller on three; for treasurer, Des Roschers and Schnitzer are each on five; for highway commissioner Allen is on four, Brunnean on four and Wagner on two.

J. W. Alt is improving very rapidly. His physicians say that he will be around shaking hands with his friends in a few days. Contractor McCurdy had about twenty-five men at work yesterday shoveling the ice and snow off the bridge and now has both ends barred so

that no teams can cross. It will take two weeks for repairs before teams can cross and they now have a roadway across the ice. It is stated that S. E. Cleaves & Son are to build about fifteen houses this spring for their employees. Mr. Cleaves is also to put up an elegant residence for himself. This will give Ripley quite a boom.

Miss Alice McKernan returned yesterday noon from L'Anse, where she has been visiting her parents, and has resumed her work in the postoffice. Dr. H. G. Grover, who was before Justice Finn the other day, filed his credentials with the county clerk yesterday and is now a registered physician in this country.
