BETTER RAILROAD SERVICE. Marquette and Ontonagon Counties Brought Closer Together Than Ever Before. The opening of the recently completed Mineral Range extension by the D. S. & A. railway on Monday next from Keweenaw Bay will be a great event for the towns of Marquette county, as it will bring them in close touch with the growing and progressive towns of Mass City, Rockland and Ontonagon. The train leaving Marquette at 7:00 a. m., Negaunee 7:45 a. m. and Ishpeming 7:55 a. m. will make close connection at Keweenaw Bay (daily except Sunday) with the day express from Calumet arriving Mass City 11:57 a. m., Rockland 12:15 p. m. and Ontonagon 12:45 p. m.
