FIFTEENTH ANNUAL REVIEW OF THE LAKE SUPERIOR IRON ORE TRADE.

(Copyright, 1900, by Horace J. Stevens)
The year 1900 has been marked by the greatest activity and the largest production in the history of the Lake Superior iron district.

Iron ore was first found in the vicinity of Lake Superior in the summer of 1844, under an uprooted stump, by E. S. Rockwell and S. T. Carr.

While the products of these Mesaba range mines appear small in comparison with the figures of production achieved by mines of the older ranges, it should be taken into consideration that the Mesaba is still a very new mining field.

Half a century ago the iron and copper mines of Lake Superior were further from the Atlantic seaboard, judged by facilities for travel and transportation, than Cape Nome or Kong Kong are today.

Small as the first ship canal at the Soo would seem today, if placed beside the latest artificial channels, it was the latest and greatest of its kind.

For the honorable distinction of having produced the greatest amount of ore since first opened, four mines are very closely bunched.

In addition to the foregoing rail-and-lake shipments, the Peninsula division of the Chicago & Northwestern railway handled 224,185 tons of ore all-rail, between the mines and local furnaces.

In addition to the foregoing figures, a sixth range has shipped ore, during 1900, for the first season. The Helen mine, of the Michipicoten range, Canada, has shipped about 62,500 tons this season.

In addition to the Michipicoten, there is another Canadian iron range which must be taken into consideration. This is the Atkoken, which lies in the western portion of Algoma, north of the Mesaba and Vermilion ranges of Minnesota.
