IMPLIES CROOKED WORK.

Article in Crystal Falls Diamond Drill on Charges Against Warden Freeman.

THIS OFFICIAL TRIPPED UP A DISHONEST DEAL.

It is Alleged That Member or Members of Board of Pardons Used Trust and Position to the End of Issuing Monetary Gain.

PRISON MESS BECOMES COMPLICATED.

There has been much written and said during the last few days in the matter of the charges brought by ex-Governor Pingree against Warden Freeman of the Marquette prison.

The Diamond Drill in this week's issue charges the accusations made by ex-Governor Pingree against Warden Freeman of the Marquette prison to pique upon the part of the governor because of Freeman's securing evidence of corruption upon the part of members of the pardon board and some of Pingree's advisers through intercepted letters to prisoners.

FREEMAN'S WORK.

Several months ago a letter was intercepted by Mr. Freeman written by a brother of one of the criminals confined in the prison. It was stated in the letter that a member of the pardon board had written that the prisoner's release could be had for a certain stated financial consideration.

It is intimated that the evidence implicates other than members of the pardon board, officials who were high in the Pingree political family. Soon after this occurrence, it is alleged that the deputy warden was discovered by Mr. Freeman trying to undermine him and it is alleged that this man, whose name is Mosher, was made the agency through which Mr. Freeman's removal was to be accomplished.

The whole matter was laid before the board of control by Mr. Freeman

some time ago and is no surprise to those on the inside. Members of this board think that there is evidence enough in the letters in possession of the board to warrant the calling of a grand jury to investigate the wholesale pardoning done by Governor Pingree during the last few days of his term.

QUITE CREDIBLE.

The above statements throw much light on the matter and they, presumably, contain the gist of the information which Warden Freeman chose to retain when he was first questioned concerning the charges. There has been a well defined feeling here that there was much to be said in explanation of the sudden descent on Warden Freeman's head if those who were in a position to make the truth known chose to do so.

It is only fair to Mr. Mosher to observe that the part of the Sentinel's dispatch which relates to him is entirely surmise and if it had its origin in Mr. Mosher he will not find that all the members of the board of control concur in his opinion that the deputy deliberately set about undermining his superior. A great many people scoff at this suggestion while they insist that Warden Freeman made a bad mistake in letting Mr. Mosher out. Others express a belief that the deputy must have been the source of some of the information on which the charges were grounded and are of the opinion that the warden acted wisely in letting the case fall.

As far as is known here Governor Bliss has, to date, given no expression of opinion relative to the charges. It is likely that he will desire their thorough investigation and that he will lend his support and assistance to the members of the board of control in probing them to the bottom.

The matter still creates much discussion here. It will be in no way allayed by the latest development.

BISHOP MRAK'S FUNERAL.

Notable Service Held Saturday Morning at 9 a. m.

The remains of the late Ignatius Marak, second bishop of the diocese of Sault Ste. Marie and Marquette and titular bishop of Antinoe, were laid to rest in the bishops' vault at St. Peter's cathedral Saturday morning at the conclusion of a notable service, beginning at 9:30 a. m.

Heading the list was the Most Reverend Archbishop Katzer of Milwaukee, the Right Reverend Bishop Foley of Detroit, the Right Reverend Bishop Richter of Grand Rapids and the Right Reverend Bishop Eis. The clergymen of the diocese were represented by Monsignor Rev. Charles Langner of Negaunee, Rev. J. M. Langner of Ishpeming, Rev. G. Terhorst of Assinibois, Rev. H. Bourion of Menominee, Rev. P. C. Mesnard of Escanaba, Rev. M. Faust of Menominee, Rev. A. Rezek of Houghton, Rev. A. C. Keller of Hancock, Rev. James Miller of Dollar Bay, Rev. Caspar Mats of Calumet, Rev. Joseph Sauriol of L'Anse, Rev. Bede Oldegeering of Escanaba, Rev. James Corcoran of Schaeffer, Rev. James Lenhart of Iron River, Rev. A. W. Gees of Republic, Rev. A. Doser of St. Ignace, Rev. Joseph Hollinger of Gladstone, Rev. H. Bucholtz of Munising, Rev. Glaser of Newberry, Rev. F. X. Barth of Stephenson, Rev. A. Vermare, Rev. P. Manderfield and Rev. J. G. Pinten of Marquette. There were also present from outside Monsignor Fox and Rev. J. A. Seibach of Green Bay.

Preceding the requiem pontifical high mass, the visiting prelates participated in the office for the dead, as is usual at such ceremonies.

The funeral oration was delivered by the Right Reverend Bishop Richter of Grand Rapids, who spoke for a half an hour or more. This prelate had a personal acquaintance with the deceased bishop and was well informed concerning the high life, his work among the Indians and as the ruler of the diocese of Sault Ste. Marie and Marquette.
