Mr. Orr is well known in Marquette and his departure will be generally regretted, particularly as it is extremely unlikely that he will ever return to the city. He came here May 1, 1887, to assume the position of general freight agent of the South Shore road, which he city continuously until 1893 when ho went to Duluth, it having been deemed expedient to establish the general freight office there.
