Cincinnati, Nov. 12.—Tonight President Roosevelt is speeding down through Kentucky on his way to Smedes, Mass., about twenty-five miles north of Vicksburg, for a four-days bear hunt. The place selected for the hunt is some miles from the railroad and is in the region which was formerly the favorite hunting ground of General Wade Hampton, the famous leader of the Confederate Black Horse cavalry.

Tomorrow morning upon the arrival of the president's train at Memphis, he will be joined by Mr. Fish and John McElenny, who was a lieutenant in the president's regiment during the Spanish war. The train will then proceed to Smedes, and there will be run upon a siding to remain until next Wednesday, when the president will return to Memphis.

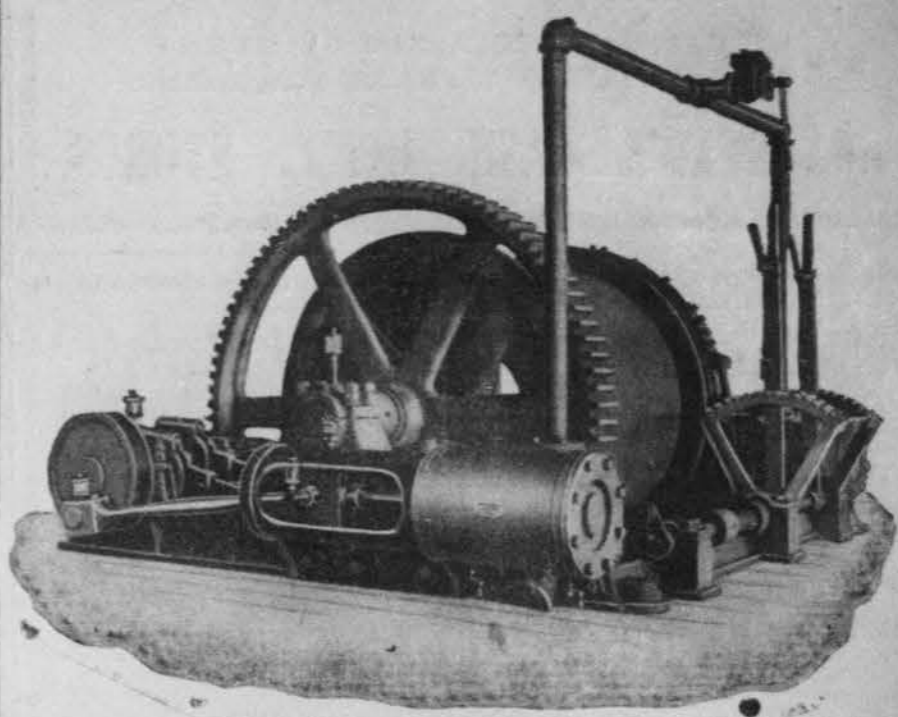
