PAVE IRON STREET. CHURCH NEARLY COMPLETED.

Business Man Thinks It Should Be Done After Removal of Street Car Tracks.

"I would like to see the council let a contract for the paving of Iron street after the street railway line is transferred to its new route," said a business man yesterday. "With the street car line off the street it will be no trouble to keep it in first-class condition during the summer season, and the expense will be considerably reduced in the winter. The city's finances are in good condition; the bonded indebtedness is not heavy and with the charter revised to empower the taxpayers to issue more bonds I don't think the money that would be expended for pavement could be expended to better advantage at this time. Iron street is now a reproach to the city. The road is so thick that people can hardly cross the street. A pavement would save the business men money, as their stocks would not be damaged by the dust during the dry seasons. Personally I think the council should look into the paving proposition, and if possible ascertain the sentiment of the taxpayers. If the money can be provided without imposing too heavy a tax I think the street should be paved. I am not prepared to say about what the improvement would cost, but I should imagine that from \$35,000 to \$40,000 would be sufficient for a complete job from Cyr street to Pioneer avenue."

It is not known when the Marquette County Gas & Electric company will be ready to change its route. Trouble may be had in securing the necessary material, and there is besides another matter that Manager McCormick wishes to have disposed of. He intends to ask the councils of both cities to extend the company's franchise over a period of the life of the bonds. The present franchises will terminate for a number of years, but it is proposed to ask that it be extended an additional fifteen or twenty years. It is not anticipated that the company will have the least difficulty securing an extension.
