WERE MUCH PLEASED WITH SAN ANTONIO

Prominent Lake Superior mining men believe that large and rich ore bodies will be developed at the property. The outcroppings at San Antonio are the finest that I have ever seen at a copper property," says W. H. Johnston, range superintendent of the Oliver Iron Mining company, who arrived home Sunday from Mexico, where he, together with O. C. Davidson, Dr. Crowell and Ed. Kingsford, of Iron Mountain, inspected the mine. The members of the party were met at Bisbee by H. F. Ellard, formerly of the Gogebic range, who is assisting John R. Wood in the management of the property.

There are at present forty men working under Messrs. Wood and Ellard, all being employed in development work. The property contains several drifts and cross cuts that were opened up many years ago when it was operated by the natives. These have been found to contain rich copper ore and one crosscut opened in the formation on the east side of the mountain contains ore of good quality the entire width of 100 feet. Ore taken from one of the tunnels at various points in a distance of 400 feet assayed on an average of 11 per cent mineral.

Mr. Johnston says that Mr. Wood is conducting the development work to excellent advantage and that he has achieved fine results. He started exploratory work on his own account two years ago last November and has been continuously on the job ever since.

Mr. Johnston expresses the opinion that the property will be a big winner, as the ore bodies are apparently large and unusually rich. Operations are at present largely confined to tunneling and crosscutting. Several tunnels to keep the mountain side, where promising outcroppings have been located. In each instance the formation has proved up satisfactorily and in many cases the results have been astonishing. Mr. Johnston says that it will not be necessary to install pumping machinery, at least until operations are extended at a considerable distance below the surface. There is enough ore in sight in the mountain to keep several hundred men at work for a large force employed for many years. The ore can be transported from the workings to the track below by a gravity tram at a small cost.

A branch of the Southern Pacific railway is being extended to the property and it is now within the reach of about 1200 miles. The cost of the construction work and the management of the road expects that the line will be completed to the mine by the first of November. No attempt will be made to get in machinery until the railway is finished, as the cost of transportation over the mountains and through the valleys would be very heavy. The railroad is to follow the Yaqui river.

There has been considerable trading in San Antonio stock since the return of Mr. Johnston and the three Iron Mountain men. All of the latter are officers of the company. Their report has been of a nature to encourage buying and it is said that none of the officers are selling their stock. The company is organized with 250,000 shares, with a par value of \$10 per share; 200,000 shares have been issued, and 100,000 of these are non-assessable. It is said that only about 20,000 shares are being traded in.

Mr. Johnston said he knew positively that Mr. Wood, who took stock in payment for the property, has not sold any of his holdings. Of the 100,000 shares assessable \$1 per share has been paid in.
