To the Hon. Board of Supervisors of Marquette County.

Gentlemen: - Your Committee on County Parks reports that it met with the Board of County Park Trustees on July 12th, and by courtesy of William Gray, Superintendent of the Marquette County Road Commission, assisted by Fred Weiland, Bill Ottman, made an inspection of the County Parks.

Some time ago, the Board of Supervisors designated the Marquette County Road Commission as the Board of Trustees for the County Parks for the actual management of the parks. This Board has no complaints or recommendations for referral to the Board of Supervisors.

This Committee reports that the County Parks generally are in very good condition.

Perkins Park at Big Bay, consists of about sixty five acres, and last year was used by approximately five hundred outsiders. The park is also used to a great extent by the

local people. The main attraction for non-residents is the fishing. Walter Krieg is the caretaker and lives there in a five room house. Mr. Krieg operates a small concession for the accommodation of the campers and also rents boats. The main improvement for this park being considered is some means of protecting the bank along the shore of the lake.

The Gwinn Park consists of 7 acres, located on the Escanaba River, not far from the main section of town. This park is used mostly by the local people. There is no electric current available for trailers. The park has good swimming facilities and during hours for such activity, is under the supervision of a lifeguard. There is no full time care-taker employed.

Van Riper Park is the outstanding recreational facility of the County. It consists of eight hundred forty acres on the east shore of Lake Michigamme and north of the highway to the Peshekee River. Extensive bathing facilities are available and last year approximately 22,900 bathers took advantage of the facilities. The park lastyear was attended by 106,210 people. July 4th of last year was the day of largest attendance - 11,000 people.

Bert Gaboury is the caretaker at the park and lives there the year around. He has

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other help and two lifeguards are there daily. Tennis courts, baseball diamonds and other facilities for games are available. The park is used extensively by campers, who are required to register with the caretaker. Proper rules and regulations are enforced to maintain the high character of the park. Electric current, wood and stoves are furnished to the campers. A small charge is made for the electric current.

The picnic tables and buildings this year are in need of paint, but this is the first year that such facilities were not repainted. Generally, the repainting is an annual project and it will be done before the opening of next year's season.

The food and bost concession at the park is operated by Will Mitchell, and the difficulties in connection with such business caused by the war are being properly alleviated by considerate action of the Board of Trustees and Mr. Mitchell. Every effort is being made to retain reasonable prices.

Mr. Gaboruy is in constant touch with Dr. Van Riper and the Board of Park Trustees and all of them are now working on several small matters for general improvement of the area.

The Board of Park Trustees is continually conscious of the needed improvements for all of the parks and such will be made as funds permit. It is expected that the attend-ance this year at all of the parks will exceed that of last year by at least ten or fifteen per cent. The Board of Park Trustees render an annual report to the Board of Supervisors and more detailed information is usually contained therein.



We first called at the Court House and a thorough inspection was made. We found the general appearance of the building in good condition. A suggestion was made that the ventilation in the various vaults could be improved by the installation of fans. A few minor repairs are needed in the ceiling in the Agriculture Department over the Stenographer's desk.

Inspection was made of the jail building where we found everything in good clean condition A previous suggestion for repairs to some plumbing fixtures is being taken care of, but parts are slow in arriving for some obsolete type fixtures. A cell door on the third floor is in need of attention, and the shower room needs some cement work repairs.

We made a call at the building occupied by the probation officer, Mr. Miles Betts and family. The building needs some attention on the outside where portions of the stucco are giving way on the South side where the detention cells are located. The windows in the cell block leak and some attention is needed to take care of the water falling from the roof.

August 17th, 1949.

We next visited the Citizen's Home where we found the ground well kept and the building in a good clean condition. It was called to our attention that some repairs are needed on the roof of the proch facing North. We noticed a large tree formerly standing in front of the porch had recently been removed, greatly improving the view from that part of the building. The neat appearance of the furnace room was noticed, but suggestion was made to have a railing placed at the rear of the furnace for greater safety.

We next visited the Sanatorium where Dr. Acocks conducted us around. We made a trip to the roof of the South unit where repairs to the roof edge were under way, to correct a condition of erosion from water seepage.

In all Departments, your committee received full co-operation, and we appreciate the courtesies extended us during the visit. We wish also to thank Mr. William Gray and his assistants in assisting the committee in their visit.

I find that an apinion of the Attorney General and several Supreme Court cases sustain the porposition that it is lawful for the Board of Supervisors to adjourn the annual meeting to a later date and even a later month and that it may at such an adjourned meeting lawfully perform acts required to be performed at the annual meeting. It appears that the common practice is to simply adjourn the October meeting to the date that one would hold the regular November meeting. Care should be taken however, that the motion for adjournment specifically shows that the October meeting is being adjourned to that later date.

I trust that this satisfactorily answers the question you had in mind.



The Marquette County Social Welfare Board wishes to advise you that due to an emergent situation created by the recent steel strike, they employed five additional employees to supplement the regular welfare staff. These employees were classified and rated as follows: three intake workers at \$30.00 per week and two stenographer - clerks at \$35.00 per week.

In connection with the above, and considering the factor that the Social Welfare Board did not have an opportunity to present this matter to your Board which met on October 10th, prior to the acceptance of the first strike case applications for direct relief assistance on October 13th, the Social Welfare Board requests that the Board of Supervisors concur in the action taken by the Social Welfare Board.

The Social Welfare Board also wishes to advise you that, effective November 18th, three of the above mentioned additional employees who were employed as intake workers, have been released from the staff on account of the steel strike settlement.

The Social Welfare Board further requests concurrence by the Board of Supervisors in the retention of two stenorgaphers on the welfare staff to expedite the processing of the large volume of unfinished work involved which must be completed according to the minimum requirements of the State Welfare Commission.





The Honorable Board of Supervisors of Marquette County met pursuant to a call duly made at the Court House, in the City of Marquette, on Wednesday, the 17th day of May, A. D. 1950, at 2:00 o'clock P. M.

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman, Thomas J. Nicholas, Sr.

The roll call being called, the following Supervisors were found to be present:

On motion of Supervisor Bouley, supported by Supervisor Pepin and carried, the Board dispensed with the reading of the minutes of the last regular meeting.

A communication from the Upper Peninsula Development Bureau, asking the Board to name two directors to the Bureau as in the past, was read. Supervisor Kivela moved that the Chairman be authorized to appoint two delegates. Supported by Supervisor Francis and carried.

A request from Mr. Stanley Williams, the County Superintendent of Schools, for additional clerical help for two or three months, in the summer was read. Supervisor Kivela moved the request be granted. Supported by Supervisor Bouley. Supervisor Van Riper moved as an amendment that the matter be referred to the Budget and Executive Committee with the power to act. Supported by Supervisor Williams. The amendment was put and it carried. The original motion as amended was then voted upon and it likewise carried.

A communication from the Chairman, Mr. Robert Clark, of the Bar Association Portrait Committee, relative to Judge Bell's portrait, was read. Mr. Clark stated Mr. Salvatore Andriacchi of Ishpeming was engaged to paint the portrait at a cost of \$400.00 and that if any counties in the 25th Judicial District were to order a similar portrait that the amount of \$25.00 for each County would be refunded to Marquette County. A petition signed by 31 taxpayers of Chocolay Township, urging extension of County Road 484 a distance of $l\frac{1}{4}$ miles was read. Supervisor Larson moved the matter be referred to the Marquette County Road Commission with a strong recommendation that the request be acted upon as soon as possible. Supported by Supervisor Corneliuson and carried.

The report of the Auditing Committee was read. Supervisor Van Riper moved the adoption of the report. Supported by Supervisor Muck and carried by the following Yea and Nay vote:

The following report of the Conservation Committee was read. Supervisor Hill moved the adoption of the report as read. Supported by Supervisor Francis. Supervisor Van Riper moved that as an amendment that the communication be referred back to the Conservation Committee for further study. Supported by Supervisor Corneliuson. The amendment was voted upon and it carried. The original motion as amended was then voted upon and it also carried.

Report of Conservation Committee:

Your Committee met on April 27, 1950, to consider the communication received at the last regular meeting from the Big Bay Sportsmen's Club pertaining to the repair and maintainance of the Iron River dam at the outlet of Lake Independence. The Committee meeting was also attended by Bernard Stephansky, of the Conservation Department, Frank J. Russell, Jr., of Marquette and the Prosecuting Attorney.

Various phases of the problem were discussed at length and the Prosecuting Attorney outlined the various legal problems and procedures involved. It was the consensus of the Committee that the present communication from Big Bay does not make it mandatory upon this Board to take official action at this time under the relevant statutes relating to the maintainance of water levels.

It is also the consensus of the Committee, however, that a very real problem exists in regard to this dam; that it appears to be in a most dangerous condition; and the Prosecutor advised us that if the proper petition should later be filed with this Board, it will become mandatory on the part of the Board to take legal action. The Prosecutor also advised us that the Board could proceed to act without formal petition, either with or without the cooperation of the Conservation Commission. Any such action would, however, involve the expenditure of public monies.

Your Committee also considered various ways and means of helping to presently relieve the emergent condition of the dam, by temporary repairs or otherwise, but, upon the advice of the Prosecutor reluctantly concluded that it had no power to act.

Your Committee recommends that the Prosecutor be directed to contact the Ford Motor Company, the owner of the dam, formally notifying it of the emergent condition of the dam and requesting it to immediately repair the same.

We also recommend that the Board authorize this or some other appropriate committee to forthwith proceed to inquire into the possibility of making the question of the proper repair and maintainance of this dam a continuing project under the so-called Pittman-Robertson Act.



Mr. Lloyd LeVasseur, Marquette County Clerk, Marquette, Michigan. Dear Mr. LeVasseur:

Recently we had a request from the United States Board on Geographic Names, which was as follows:

"We have received a request from the U. S. Geological Survey for decisions on the seven lakes and four creeks in Marquette County listed on the attached sheet.

To expedite completion of cases on these names we are sending the list to you at once in order that the Michigan Georgaphic Board and the Marquette County Board of Supervisors may be deciding on the names they wish to recommend to the Board on Geonames for decision".

We are enclosing a copy of the list of names to be submitted to your County Board of Supervisors. The "Old Names" appear to have been taken principally from U. S. Geological Survey Monograph 28, and its accompanying Atlas, dated 1896, while the solumn entitled "New Names" represents the opinion of the submitting agency as to the present local usage based on recent mining maps, state map and other publications.

It is desired that the County Board's decisions reflect the present local usage. This may mean that a choice is made between the "Old and New Names" or the Board may find it advisable to submit a name which does not appear in either column.

The State Board on Georgraphic Names acts mainly as an intermediary between the County and United States Boards, and dissents with the local decisions only when they do not conform to the regulations of the Federal Board. We would like to recommend, however, that names Mud and Rock not be considered as possible names to be used in the future, or to have official decisions upon, as these would add to the present long list of Mud and Rock Lakes in Michigan.

The County Board of Supervisors most likely will wish to do investigative work previous to rendering decisions, and if there are any questions about the matter, we shall be happy to assist. Under separate cover we are sending copies of the Procedure for Officially changing names of lakes, rivers and streams, which outlines the necessary steps to be taken. With these forms we are including the forms to be completed and certified by you after the decisions have been rendered. Just as soon as we receive these, we shall transmit the decisions to the United States Board for final decision.

The United States Board has requested that if there are any other names by which the features have been known, in addition to those listed, it would like to be informed. This could be shown on the form after the phrase, "be changed from",

Remarks of Ralph R. Eldredge on the Occasion of the Unveiling of the Portrain of Hon. Frank A. Bell.

Frank A. Bell was appointed Judge of the Twenty-Fifth Judicial Circuit on October 17, 1927, to succeed Judge Richard A. Flannigan, who had been appointed to the Supreme Court of Michigan. He served this Circuit well and faithfully for twenty years and voluntarily retired December 31, 1947, at the age of seventy-eight. During all those years he was never opposed for re-election.

Frank A. Bell was born on a farm near Springport in Calhoun County, Michigan, on November 28, 1868. He graduated from the Grayling High School in 1887, and entered the University of Michigan Law School, from which he was graduated in 1890.

After finishing law school he moved up on a homestead Northwest of Marquette, in this County. He came to love the North country, and in the year 1892 he settled in Negaunee, where he has resided ever since.

He was City Attorney of the City of Negaunee for ten years, and Prosecuting Attorney of this County for fourteen years. His ability and integrity gained for him the position as Michigan attorney for the Chicago & Northwestern Railroad Company and the U.S.Steel Corporation, which positions he held until his appointment as Circuit Judge. He came to be one of the leading authorities in the Upper Peninsula on railroad and mining law. He was recognized as one of the leaders of the legal profession in the Upper Peninsula, and his appointment as Circuit Judge of the Twenty-fifth Circuit came as no surprise to his friends and colleauges.

In politics he has always been a Republican, and prior to his appointment as Circuit Judge he was Chairman of the Republican County Committee.

He was made a Mason in Negaunee in April, 1896, and in 1948 received the Honorary Thirty-third Degree.

During his twenty years service on the bench, Judge Bell made an enviable record. With his fine legal mind and his fearless willingness to "call them as he saw them", his record of affirmances of cases appealed to the Supreme Court was far above the average. It may also be said that because of the recognition of his ability by the Bar of this Circuit, a relatively small percentage of his decisions and rulings were appealed to the Supreme Court.

As was to be expected, Judge Bell's long service as Circuit Judge was characterized by courteous treatment of the Bar and the Public. He had no need to errect any barrier between himself and the Bar in order to preserve the dignity of the Court. His personal integrity was such that he could mingle freely with the Bar of his Circuit, with no thought that we might fear that some member might impose on his friendship to gain some advantage. He was consistently helpful to the Bar, particularly its younger lawyers, but always impartially. In his handling of criminal sentences, he applied his sound, humane common sense in determining and doing what was best for the offender and for society.

Perhaps no greater compliment can be paid him than to say that in every respect he lived up to the high standards set, by Judges Claudius B. Grant, John W. Stone and Richard C. Flannigan who preceeded him as Circuit Judges of this Circuit, and each of whom went from there to the Supreme Court of Michigan.

It is a privilege and a pleasure for the Bar of Marquette County to be able to

pay this tribute of affection and respect to Judge Bell in his lifetime and in his presence. Rose I The following report of the Highways and Bridges Committee and the Marquette County Road Commission was read. Supervisor Muck moved the adoption of the report. Supported by Supervisor Corneliuson and unanimously carried.

Ishpeming, Michigan October 6, 1950.

Hon. Chairman and Members of Marquette Co. Bd. of Supervisors, Marquette County, Michigan.

Gentlemen:

Your Committee on Highways and Bridges met with the County Road Commission on Sept-

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ember 19, 1950, to consider several petitions referred by your Board for joint action.

In the matter of the petition from several residents of Tilden Township requesting the elimination of the dust nuisance on a portion of Road PA and on Road PN we find that the section of Road PA has been given a surface treatment of tar, which corrects the condition as requested. On Road PN, on which there are a very few residents, the dust condition has been taken care of by the use of calcium chloride.

In the matter of the petition requesting that the West Branch Road (Road CCE) in Ely Township be graded and the holes patched, we find that the worst spots have been corrected by patching, and that prior to the opening of the hunting season, additional work will be done to improve the condition of the road.

In the matter of the petition requesting surfacing on Road OJ in Skandia Township, we find the road has been graveled with base-course gravel and is given regular maintenance, and that a crushed gravel surfacing will be applied when the crusher is again set up in the Lawson pit. In the matter of the petition from property owners along Lake Superior in Chocolay Township, requesting the improvement of an addition $l\frac{1}{4}$ miles of Road 484, we find that the work requested will take care of only a portion of the area needing service. Inasmuch as County Road 484 is parallel to, and in most cases only a few hundred feet from State Trunk Line M-28, we feel that to build approximately three miles of 484 would be a duplication in both construction and maintenance, at a considerable cost to the County. We recommend that the Road Commission together with the Chocolay Township Board, make a study of the situation with the idea of making access roads to the resort area from M-28 at convenient intervals so as to adequately serve the area, instead of building approximately three miles of Road 484.

At the joint meeting, a general discussion was held relative to the demands being made upon the Road Commission for road improvements and additional services and wish to sjbmit, as a part of this report, an analysis of the Road Commission's situation and their ability to meet these demands.

The major portion of the construction and improvement work done in the past two years has been done with the aid of Township funds. These jobs cover several types of work, some tarring, some graveling and others grading and the amount of Township participation depends upon the type of work being done and upon the Township funds available.

In 1940, the Road Commission received \$112,000.00 in County Road taxes and \$196,000. 00 from Gas and Weight taxes. In addition to this, there was a cash balance at the beginning of the year of \$215,000.00. These amounts, together with receipts from the State Maintanance contract and other miscellaneous receipts made available to the Commission approximately \$600,000.00 for the year.

In 1949, the year was started with a balance of \$11,000.00. Receipts from County Road Taxes amounted to \$82,000.00 and from Gas and Weight taxes, \$245,000.00. These, with other receipts made a total available for 1949 of \$554,000.00 or \$46,000.00 less than in 1940.

In this same period from 1940 to 1949, wages and salaries increased approximately 85 percent; materials, such as tar, stone, culvert pipe, etc., increased 60 percent and equipment costs averaged 65 percent higher. With decreased revenues and increased costs during this period, it has not been possible for the Road Commission to carry on a normal program of improvements and construction, nor to make needed replacements in equipment.

Another condition which materially affected the finances of the Commission, had to do with the period during the war. During these years, the Commission was not permitted to carry on any construction program, nor were they permitted to purchase new equipment. As a result, on January 1, 1947, there was a cash balance of \$308,000.00 which was to be used for deferred improvements and equipment replacements. In 1947, however, the County Road tax was reduced to \$37,000.00 in 1948, it was \$80,000.00 and in 1949 it was \$82,000.00 as compared with \$112,000.00 in 1940. As a result, the funds which had been accumulated during the war for construction and equipment had to be used for maintenance and routine operations, with operating costs increasing each year.

This is the general situation as it has affected the Road Commission and the highway program in Marquette County over the past few years. In addition to this, some jobs have come in for special considerationand comment, one of which is Road 550 running from Marquette to Big Bay.

This road during the war years and during the period of very active logging operations was almost completely destroyed. The Road Commission recognized the need for re-building this road and negotiated with the Bureau of Public Roads for Federal Aid in restoring it to the point where it would adequately handle the traffic to which it was subjected. During the 1949 season, work costing approximately \$65,000.00 was done on this road, and plans were made to complete the work in the 1950 season, with half of the cost being paid for from Federal funds and half from County funds. The work remaining to be done in 1950 consisted of tarring from the Halfway to Big Bay, which is now gravel and a tar seal on the portion south from the Halfway, which was improved during 1949. In June, 1950, plans were completed and late in June the Bureau of Public Roads requested certain changes in design and plans, which changes were made. The revised plans are now in Lansing awaiting Federal approval and when such approval is received, the work will go on. It should be understood that the Road Commission is taking advantage of the various programs, such as Federal Aid, but where Federal agencies, which pay one-half the cost, are involved, considerable time is required before the work can go on.

Another item of work performed by the Road Commission which should be commented on is the matter of snow removal. In 1940 the cost of snow removal on county roads, exclusive of State Trunk Lines, was approximately \$115,000.00 or 23 per cent of the total expenditure of the Commission for the year. This snow removal cost is entirely a service cost, with nothing to show for the expenditure in the spring after the snow is gone and each year the demand for increased and improved snow removal is growing.

Your Committee on Highways and Bridges and your Road Commission are vitally interested in the highways in Marquette county and in the service to the public in Marquette County but we feel that without additional financial relief provided by the Legislature or other sources, a normal highway program cannot be carried on by the Road Commissions in Michigan.

Supervisor Larson moved the nominations be closed and a unanimous ballot be cast by the Clerk for his election. Supported by Supervisor Bouley and carried unanimously. The Clerk stated the ballot was cast and the Chairman declared Mr. Heiden duly elected to the Social Welfare Commission for a period of three years.

On motion of Supervisor Kivela, supported by Supervisor Corneliuson and carried, the Board recessed until 11:00 A.M. to enable the Finance and Taxation Committee to complete their report to the Board.



COURT HOUSE:

At the Court House we would suggest that the lighting in the offices of the lower floor be checked into with a view of changing over to the newer type of lights in use today.

The outside of the Court House itself should be considered as to the need of painting the wooden window frames, etc.

JAIL:

The jail was in a very neat condition and we are pleased to see that recognition was given Marquette County by the State Dept. for the splendid condition of our County Jail. Certain cell repairs have been completed since our last inspection, by cementing in fixtures.

DETENTION HOME:

The repairs recommended on our last visit have been completed, such as renewing cement work on the outside of the building and repairs to the roof to stop water from running into the windows of the cell block.

A new Holland furnace and a stoker have been installed and this home seems to be in a very comfortable condition.

CITIZENS HOME:

The general appearance of the building is very attractive and it is clean and comfortable for the occupants.

The floor in the large sitting room on the East side needs a covering of some kind, and we would suggest that estimates be received for this work.

Also, the stairway to the women's quarters needs some attention.

In the boiler room, we noticed that the railing around the boiler has been put in place.

MORGAN HEIGHTS SANATORIUM:

The roof of the main building needs some attention for repairs to the covering.

There are a few other items that Dr. Acocks would like such as a combination building of shop, garage and living quarters for the caretaker and wife.

Also, there is the possibility of black-topping the parking area.

The steam line from the boiler room to the Nurses' Home and Doctor's Home should be checked.

Your Committee wishes to thank Mr. Wm. A. Gray and his staff for the assistance given in making our trip possible; also to the attendant at the jail and to all those who helped make our trip worthwhile as far as the County work is concerned.

GRANT AGREEMENT Part 1 - Offer

> Date of Offer, Oct. 27, 1950. K. I. Sawyer Airport Project No. 9-20-021-102

TO: County of Marquette, Michigan. (herein referred to as the "Sponsor")

FROM: The United States of America (acting through the Administrator of Civil Aeronautics herein referred to as the "Administrator")

WHEREAS, the Sponsor has submitted to the Administrator a Project Application dated August 28, 1950 for a grant of Federal funds for a project for development of the K. I. Sawyer Airport (herein called the "Airport"), together with plans and specifications for for such project, which Project Application, as approved by the Administrator, is hereby incorporated herein and made a part hereof; and

WHEREAS, the Administrator has approved a project for development of the Airport (herein called the "Project") consisting of the following described airport development: "Furnish and install elevated runway lighting system on the N-S runway, beacon, lighted wind indicating device and segmented circle marker." (This work is in addition to that included in Project No. 9-20-021-701.)

All as more particularly described in the property map and plans and specifications incorporated in the said Project Application:

NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to and for purposes of carrying out the provisions of the Federal Airport Act (60 Sta. 170; Publ Law 377, 79th Congress), and in consideration of (a) the Sponsor's adoption and ratification of the representations and assurances

contained in said Project Application, and its acceptance of this offer, as hereinafter provided, and (b) the benefits to accrue to the United States and the public from the accomplishment of the Project and the operation and maintenance of the Ajrport, as herein provided.

The Administrator, for and on behalf of the United States, hereby offers and agrees to pay, as the United States' share of costs incurred in accomplishing the project, 50 per centum of all allowable project costs, subject to the following terms and conditions:

1. The maximum obligation of the United States payable under this offer shall be \$8,500.00.

2. The Sponsor shall:

(a) begin accomplishment of the Project within a reasonable time after acceptance of this Offer, and

(b) carry out and complete the Project in accordance with the terms of this Offer and the Federal Airport Act and the Regulations promulgated thereunder by the Administrator in effect on the date of this Offer, which Act and Regulations are incorporated herein and made a part hereof, and

(c) carry out and complete the Project in accordance with the plans and specifications and property map incorporated herein as they may be revised or modified with the approval of the Administrator or his duly authorized representatives.

3. The Sponsor shall operate and maintain the Airport as provided in the Project Application incorporated herein.

4. The maximum amounts of building space which the Sponsor shall be obligated to furnish Civil Agencies of the United States for the purposes and on the terms and conditions stated in Paragraph 9 of Part III of the Project Application is set forth in the attached Schedule of Maximum Space Requirements, which is incorporated herein and made a part hereof.

5. Any misrepresentation or omission of a material fact by the Sponsor concerning the Project or the Sponsor's authority or ability to carry out the obligations assumed by the Sponsor in accepting this Offer shall terminate the obligation of the United States and it is understood and agreed by the Sponsor in accepting this Offer, that if a material fact has been misrepresented or omitted by the Sponsor, the Administrator on behalf of the United States may recover all grant payments made.

6. The Administrator reserves the right to amend or withdraw this Offer at any time prior to its acceptance by the Sponsor.

7. This Offer shall expire and the United States shall not be obligated to pay any of the allowable costs of the project unless this Offer has been accepted by the Sponsor within 60 days from the above date of Offer or such longer time as may be prescribed by the Administrator in writing.

8. (a) The Administrator, in tendering this Offer on behalf of the United States, recognizes the existence of an agency relationship between the County of Marquette, Michigan, as principal and the Michigan Department of Aeronautics, as agent, created by the Agency Agreement entered into respectively between the said parties on February 20, 1946 and January 31, 1947, copy of which Agreement is attached to the Project Application dated February 11, 1948 in Project No. 9-20-021-701 and made a part of this Grant Agreement by reference; and the Sponsor agrees that it will not amend, modify or terminate said Agency Agreement without the prior approval, in writing, of the Administrator or his duly designated representative.

8. (b) It is further understood and agreed that Paragraphs (b) through (c) of Section 1 of the Sponsor's Assurance Agreement adopted by the Sponsor in connection with Project No. 9-20-021-701 attached to and made a part of the Grant Offer in such first project executed on August 5, 1948, be deleted therefrom and that the whole of Part III (Sponsor's Assurances) of the Project Application attached hereto be substituted as and for such deleted portions of the Sponsor's Assurance Agreement in such Project No. 9-20-021-701.





In the case of an emergency or in case a Department requires additional funds or needs some special equipment, which could not be foreseen at the time of the annual meeting, we recommend that the head of that Department present this matter to the Board of Supervisors for their consideration and that they grant, where deemed necessary, authority to exceed the figures established in the annual budget.

If it develops that the amount stipulated in the budget of any Department exceeds the need of that Department or if a sum authorized is found unnecessary, that we recommend that authority be granted transferring a sum or surplus to some other Department by proper resolution of the Board of Supervisors.

Your Committee on County Parks completed their inspection and submit the following report:

PERKINS PARK, BIG BAY

This park can be greatly improved without too great an outlay of money.

It is recommended that the bathing beach be bulldozed for a distance of 75 to 80 feet inland for a width of approximately 300 feet with an elevation of about 5 feet.

It is estimated that this work would require two men and the use of a bulldozer for five days.

In addition to the work at the beach, your Committee recommends that the caretaker's quarters be improved. The four rooms to be papered and painted throughout and the adjoining shed insulated.

The estimated cost for this work follows:

V The following report of the Forestry Commission was read. The Chairman ordered the report filed.

At a regular meeting of the Marquette County Forestry Commission, held on August 1, 1951, plans were instituted to plant suitable trees on a denuded area in Sands Township.

Arrangements were made whereby the actual work involved would be done by the Marquette County Road Commission, with the aid of a tree planting machine owned by the C. & N. W. Ry. Co. and the necessary trees obtained from the Michigan Department of Conservation. The Commission agreed to expend one half of their appropriation this fall to carry out this work.

The area selected included the SW_4^1 of SE_4^1 , E_5^1 of SW_4^1 , and the E_8^1 of E_8^1 of SW_4^1 of SW_4^1 in Section 25, T 46, R 25. Work started on this project September 14, when the Road Commission sent a truck to the Conservation Department Nursery at Gaylord, for 90,000 three year old Jack Pine seedlings. The project was completed on October 3rd. A total of $452\frac{1}{2}$ man hours was required to complete the project, indicating a planting rate of 200 trees per man hour. The total cost of the project was \$1,111.04, including the total labor employed, survey crew, trucking and equipment rental for planting or a cost per tree of less than $1\frac{1}{4}$ cents.

The following report of the Marquette County Road Commission was read and ordered filed by the Chairman.

Report for Month of Sept. 1951 -- State Trunk Lines

Work on the State Trunk Lines consisted of routine operations. Nine carloads of black top to be used for pavement widening and shoulder stablization were unloaded and stocked in the Road Commission's yard.

The railing on the Carp River bridge on U. S.-41 was creosoted.

Approximately 200 lineal feet of broken guard rail along U. S.-41 was repaired. The Road Commission assisted the State Highway Department in the renewing the center line markings along M-95 and M-35. Three miles of shoulder reshaping along U.S.-41 were completed. Roadside table and park sites were cleaned weekly.

County Roads

The new steel and concrete bridge on road 550 over the Little Garlic Creek was completed. The new structure is a 40 foot span and is 24 feet wide.
