January 21, 1970

The Marquette County Board of Supervisors met pursuant to a call made by the Clerk on Wednesday, the 21st day of January, A.D. 1970 at the Court House in the City of Marquette.

The meeting was called to order by the Clerk. The roll being called, the following Supervisors were present: Anderson C., Anderson H., Dompierre, Eureti, Goldsworthy, Hammerschmidt, Jacobson, Jenkin, Jernstad, Krook, Lawry, Linjala, Mattson, McCracken, Morrison, Pellonpaa, Racine, Russo, Selin, Sodergren and Yelle.

Absent: None.

The Clerk declared that nominations were in order for the office of Chairman: Sup. Russo nominated Theodore Mattson. Sup. Racine moved the nominations be closed and a unanimous ballot be cast electing Mr. Mattson. Supported by Sup. Linjala and carried.

√The Chairman declared that nominations were in order for the office of Vice-Chairman. Sup. Racine nominated Clayton Anderson. Sup. Lawry moved the nominations be closed and that a unanimous ballot be cast for Clayton Anderson. Supported by Sup. Linjala and carried.

Moved by Sup. Morrison, supported by Sup. Dompierre that the Board dispense with the reading of the minutes. Carried.

A communication from Cong. Philip E. Ruppe acknowledging resolution regarding quotas for import of iron ore was read and ordered filed.

Communications from Senate President Thomas F. Schweigert and Rep. Russell Hellman regarding resolutions opposing the shooting of antlerless deer were read and ordered filed.

Resolutions from Roscommon and Baraga counties opposing the shooting of antlerless deer were read and ordered filed.

A resolution from Sheriff Adrian Pequet urging Board support for House Bill 3572 which would provide increased State support to the Marine Safety Dept. was read. Also a resolution from Jackson County recommending support for this bill was read. Sup. Selin moved that a three man study committee be appointed to meet with the Highway Dept., County Road Commission and the Sheriff to study the matter. Supported by Sup. Sodergren and carried by 20 votes. Sup. Hammerschmidt voted No.

A communication from Marquette County Health Dept. informing the Board of action taken by the County Board of Health in clarifying a conflict between the State Ground Water Control Act, which requires a minimum of 50 feet for a water well and sewer system, and the Marquette County Sanitary Code, which requires a minimum of 75 feet of isolation. The County Board of Health has notified the State Director of Public Health of this regulation in Marquette County. Communication ordered filed.

A special committee report on the investment of county monies for short term was read. Moved by Sup. Hammerschmidt, supported by Sup. McCracken and unanimously carried that the Board concur with the recommendation of the special committee report.

A Budget and Executive committee report was read on a request from UPCAP to have the Board adopt a resolution authorizing the re-organization of UPCAP under Act 46 P.A. of Michigan, 1966. A motion was made by Sup. Jenkin that the Board concur with the recommendation of the B & E committee adopting this resolution. Supported by Sup. Krook and carried by 20 votes. Sup. Yelle voted No.

A B. & E. committee report on request for wage increase for District Court reporters and for the establishment of a Chief Deputy Clerk classification in that department, and to amend the 1970 budget by adding \$900 to the District Court budget to cover the cost involved. Motion by Sup. Krook, supported by Sup. Jernstad and unanimously carried the Board concurred with the recommendation (by roll call vote).

The report of the Audit committee for January, 1969 was read and on motion of Sup. Russo, supported by Sup. Eureti and unanimously carried by a roll call vote said report was approved.

Report of Budget and Executive Committee on the proposal to instal la pump-out facility at the Big Bay Harbor with 50% state matching funds and the balance to be paid by the county was read in which they advised that the Department of Natural Resources had advised all marina operators in Michigan that, effective January, 1971, these facilities will be required by law. Selin explained that the money is used to help promote fund requests in behalf of the university — in brief, a "lobbying fund". Comm. Yelle also voiced objection to the \$13,300 salary proposed to be paid to the director of the probate court's juvenile division and made a motion that the juvenile officver's salary remain at \$13,000. Comm. Russo pointed out that the Drain Commissioner is not scheduled for a raise in the proposed budget and that he believed an increase should be granted. The Chairman advised both Commissioners that these questions would be referred to the Budget & Executive Committee for study after the close of the public hearing.

Moved by Comm. Krook, supported by Comm. Jenkin and carried by the following roll call vote that the budget be adopted:

Yeas: Anderson, C., Anderson, H., Dompierre, Goldsworthy, Hammerschmidt, Jenkin, Krook, Lawry, Mattson, McCracken, Linjala, Morrison, Pellonpaa, Selin and Sodergren.

Nays: Russo, Yelle.

Comm. Hammerschmidt stressed that the budget as adopted was definite and that no requests for additional funds will be considered in 1971.

Moved by Comm. Russo, supported by Comm. Yelle and adopted that the Budget & Executive Committee review the matter of salary for the Drain Commissioner. Comm. Hammerschmidt dissented.

Discussion was held on the forthcoming visit of Mr. I. W. Abel, President of the United Steelworkers of America, to attend the mortgage burning ceremony at Thimmes Memorial Building in Negaunee on November 7, 1970. Moved by Comm. Sodergren, supported by Comm. Pellonpaa and unanimously adopted that November 7, 1970 be proclaimed "I. W. Abel Day" in Marquette County.

Under unfinished business, Comm. Selin brought up the subject of the need for a juvenile detention home and suggested that a special ad hoc committee be appointed to study ways and means of obtaining funds to build this facility. Comm. Hammerschmidt stated that he saw no need for another committee because the matter has already been referred to the Budget & Executive Committee and furthermore, the Building & Grounds Committee would be in charge of matters of this kind. Chairman Mattson suggested that action be delayed until receipt of the report of the Budget & Executive Committee.

Comm. Goldsworthy referred to the fact that the budget contains funds for payment of two assistant prosecutors and suggested the Budget & Executive Committee consider putting the second assistant on a six-month trial basis. Comm. Dompierre also spoke about the prosecutor's office, stating that the committee has discussed the extra burden the prosecutor has in handling district court cases but stated that law enforcement officers and others were very unhappy about the number of dismissals and reductions of charges. Next June, if the situation warrants, he thought a change in the "set-up" should be considered. Prosecutor Quinnell obtained permission to speak and told the board that he felt the request for an increase was reasonable in view of the added work-load but that he wanted no misunderstanding about the functioning of his office. It would be run according to his best ability and judgment and he didn't want the board to feel that by the power of purse it can run the prosecutor's office.

Comm. Sodergren offered remarks on the request of the Social Services Department for the additional sum of \$81,100 to finance the operations of that department for the remainder of 1971, which request has been referred to the Welfare Contact Committee for study. He recommended that a thorough study of all routines used in granting aid to welfare recipients be made with special emphasis on weeding out numerous abuses by welfare recipients. He further recommended that any persons knowing of such abuses should contact their representatives in Lansing.

Kenneth Walimaa, representative of the Marquette County Townships Association, appeared before the board and made remarks in support of the County Housing Ordinance.

There being no further business, motion was made by Comm. Anderson, supported by Comm. Pellonpaa that the board adjourn until Wednesday, November 18, 1970 at 1:30 o'clock P. M.
