

January 19, 1972

The Marquette County Board of Commissioners met, pursuant to a call duly made, at the Court House January 19, 1972, at 1:30 p.m.

The meeting was called to order by Henry A. Skewis, County Clerk. Roll was called finding all Commissioners present with the exception of Commissioner Hammerschmidt.

The Clerk declared nominations in order for the office of Chairman of the Marquette County Board of Commissioners. Commissioner Mattson nominated Commissioner Carl V. Pellonpaa. There being no further nominations, it was moved by Commissioner Jenkin, supported by Commissioner Dompierre, that a unanimous ballot be cast electing Carl V. Pellonpaa to succeed himself as Chairman of the Board.

Chairman Carl V. Pellonpaa declared nominations in order for the office of Vice Chairman. Commissioner Dompierre nominated Commissioner Clayton Anderson to succeed himself. Moved by Commissioner Jacobson, supported by Commissioner Krook, and unanimously carried, that nominations be closed and a unanimous ballot cast for Clayton Anderson as Vice Chairman.

Both gentlemen accepted with thanks and asked for co-operation between Commissioners and County officials.

It was moved by Commissioner Morrison, supported by Commissioner McCracken, and unanimously carried, that the Board dispense with the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting.

A request was made by Mr. Robert Gill, of the Army Corp. of Engineers, for a right of entry on county-owned property at K. I. Sawyer Air Force Base so that construction could commence on a proposed cement ramp addition to the Base. On recommendation of H. L. Shroeger, Superintendent Engineer of Marquette County Road Commission, the Board asked that the Chairman, Prosecuting Attorney and Mr. Shroeger meet to discuss the legal status involved. Moved by Commissioner Dompierre, supported by Commissioner Jenkin, and unanimously carried, that, following such a meeting, a tentative letter of intent would be issued the Corp. of Engineers.

A communication from the Forsyth Board regarding the Gwinn County Park was read and placed on file.

A communication from the Marquette County Planning Commission regarding the Gwinn County Park was read. It was moved by Commissioner Mattson, supported by Commissioner Morrison, and unanimously carried, that the Board concur with the recommendations of the Marquette County Planning Commission and hold the Gwinn Park in abeyance and the lease retained by the County until we have a plan for total recreation in the county. Moved by Commissioner Selin, supported by Commissioner Mattson, and unanimously carried, that the County maintain the lease on the Gwinn County Park and the County and Forsyth Township enter into a co-harness agreement in regard to the maintenance of the park.

A communication from the Department of Corrections regarding the Marquette County Jail was read and ordered placed on file.

A report from the Controller, Robert H. DeRoche, regarding the 1971 budget experience was read. Moved by Commissioner Dompierre, supported by Commissioner Jacobson, and unanimously carried by roll call vote, that the report be accepted and placed on file.

A communication from the Community Mental Health Center regarding the disposition of \$2500.00 bequeathed to the Community Mental Health Center, was read. Moved by Commissioner Dom-

pierre, supported by Commissioner Eureti, and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that the Board concur with the recommendation and allow the Community Mental Health Center to apply the \$2500.00 bequest on the balance owing for remodeling Brookridge.

A communication from the Buildings, Grounds and Insurance Committee recommending that the Chairman and County Clerk be authorized to execute an application for federal assistance on the County Jail project, was read. Moved by Commissioner Jernstad, supported by Commissioner Jenkin, and unanimously carried, that the Board concur with the recommendation of the Buildings, Grounds and Insurance Committee.

A communication from the Buildings, Grounds and Insurance Committee regarding the County's ability to raise taxes for payment of obligations to construct a new jail facility and courthouse annex was read. Moved by Commissioner Jenkin, supported by Commissioner Russo, and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that the County, City Building Authority be requested to re-examine the feasibility of proceeding with the project with the view of eventually levying millage to cover leasehold payments for the amortization of necessary bonds, in case grants are not obtainable.

A communication from the Buildings, Grounds and Insurance Committee regarding Judge DeFant's request for additional space for the Juvenile Division of Probate Court was read. Moved by Commissioner Jernstad, supported by Commissioner Lawry, and unanimously carried, that the Board concur with the recommendation of the Buildings, Grounds and Insurance Committee and hold this matter in abeyance until such time as the new proposed building construction program comes into being.

A communication from the Budget and Executive Committee regarding an additional need of \$30,000 to cover site preparation project, for the installation of an instrument landing system, at the County Airport, by the Federal Government, was read. Moved by Commissioner Jacobson, supported by Commissioner Krook, and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that \$30,000 be allotted, and that the Chairman and the County Clerk be authorized to sign the necessary documents in order to proceed with the preparation project for an instrument landing system.

A communication from the Budget and Executive Committee in regard to the Marquette County Board allotting \$5,916, matching funds money for the County Health Center for psychiatric care of indigent mental patients at St. Mary's Hospital, was read. Moved by Commissioner Krook, supported by Commissioner Clayton Anderson, and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that the County provide the necessary matching funds to cover the service, and that the appropriation to the Act 54 Mental Health Board budget for 1972 be increased by the sum of \$5,916.

A communication from the Budget and Executive Committee regarding a change in wage structure of the Juvenile Department, Probate Court, probations officers' salaries was read. Moved by Commissioner Krook, supported by Commissioner Jernstad, and carried by a roll call vote, that the Board concur with the recommendation and make the necessary salary changes. The following roll call vote was recorded:

A communication from the Budget and Executive Committee regarding service credit for Robert H. DeRoche in the Michigan

Municipal Employees Retirement System was read. Moved by Commissioner DeJuliannie, supported by Commissioner Morrison, and unanimously carried, that the Board concur with the Budget and Executive Committee's recommendation and adopt a resolution to clarify the record.

A report of the Audit Committee was read. Moved by Commissioner Russo, supported by Commissioner Lawry, and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that claims and accounts in the amount of \$63,404.24 be allowed and ordered paid and the audit report published.

It was moved by Commissioner Morrison, supported by Commissioner McCracken, and carried, that the Board dispense with the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting.

A communication from the Marquette County Clerk, Henry A. Skewis, regarding county re-apportionment was read and ordered placed on file.

A communication from the Soil Conservation District regarding Board approval for the proposed constitution and by-laws of the Upper Peninsula Resource Conservation and Development Project was read. Moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Dompierre, and unanimously carried, that the matter be referred to the Budget & Executive Committee for further study and report.

A communication from AMCAB requesting support of the by-laws for the child care committee within AMCAB was read. Moved by Commissioner Dompierre, supported by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, and carried, that the Board concur with the request of AMCAB and approve the by-laws for a co-ordinated child care committee.

A communication from the Upper Peninsula Areawide Comprehensive Health Planning Association in regard to the Board's endorsement of its application for a 5-year extension of its program was read. Moved by Commissioner Clayton Anderson, supported by Commissioner Russo, and carried, that the Board adopt an ordinance approving the Upper Peninsula Areawide Comprehensive Health Planning Association as the agency to receive the planning funds under Public Law 89-749.

Pellonpaa, called upon City Manager, Thomas McNabb, of Marquette, Michigan, to further enlighten the Board on matters of erosion. A report from the Budget & Executive Committee regarding the request of "Keep Michigan Beautiful" Committee for \$150.00 to cover postage and stationery expense was read. Moved by Commissioner Mattson, supported by Commissioner DeJuliannie, and unanimously adopted by roll call vote, that the request be granted.

A report from the Budget & Executive Committee regarding delegates to the May 19 and 20, 1972, meeting of the Upper Peninsula Association of County Commissioners, to be held at Ishpeming, Michigan, was read. He stated that these present rules provide in some cases a level of living higher than many low income families who earn their own way and that the system tolerates abuses in some areas. Moved by Commissioner Sodergren, supported by Commissioner Jenkin, and unanimously carried, that a resolution be drawn expressing the request of the Marquette County Board of Commissioners for immediate welfare reform, and that copies of the resolution be sent to our representatives in the federal and state legislatures and the U. P. Association of Counties.

A report of the Acocks Medical Facility Contact Committee was read and ordered placed on file.

A report of the Equalization Committee recommending the equalization of the 1972 tax rolls for the several townships and cities within the county was read. Moved by Commissioner C. Commissioner Sodergren discussed a recent meeting held by public officials within the county with the Motorola Corporation regarding the possibility of acquiring a county-wide radio communication system to be operated by the Sheriff's Department and for which a federal grant may be available to cover a substantial portion of the installation cost. Such a system would probably require trained dispatchers to be paid by the county through the ensuing years. He noted that in some counties the Michigan State Police provide this type of dispatcher service. Moved by Commissioner Sodergren, supported by Commissioner Dompierre, and unanimously carried, that contact be made with the Michigan State Police at Marquette to determine if this can be done, and that their reply be referred to the Budget & Executive Committee so that the matter may be given consideration.

Moved by Commissioner Eureti, supported by Commissioner DeJuliannie, and unanimously carried, that a resolution sponsored by the "Keep Michigan Beautiful" Committee designating April 21 through May 20, 1972, as statewide Clean-Up, Paint-Up, Fix-Up campaign time be adopted.

Moved by Commissioner Dompierre, supported by Commissioner Jenkin, and carried unanimously, that the following resolution be adopted and that copies be sent to our representatives in the legislature and to the State Highway Department:

"Resolved that it be the sense of the Marquette County Board of Commissioners that a north-south divided highway linking Wisconsin and Marquette, Michigan, be made a top objective in the State's highway development program to gain for the Upper Peninsula the greatest industrial gain."

Commissioner DeJuliannie read a statement explaining the impact of the iron mining industry to the people of Marquette and adjoining counties. Moved by Commissioner DeJuliannie, supported by Commissioner Armatti, and unanimously carried, that communications be addressed to our representatives at state and federal level to provide grants for the development and encouragement of the mining industry on the Marquette Range.

Commissioner Mattson expressed to the Board his concern about the spiraling welfare costs. Moved by Commissioner Mattson, supported by Commissioner Goldsworthy, and unanimously carried, that the Marquette County Board of Commissioners go

on record in favor of having the state and federal governments pay the full amount of welfare costs, and that a proper resolution be drawn on this matter and a copy furnished to Senators Griffin and Hart, to Congressman Ruppe and to our Representatives in the Michigan Legislature, together with a request that they communicate with this Board expressing their views on this subject.

Moved by Commissioner C. Anderson, supported by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, and unanimously carried, that May 17, 1972, be declared "Senior Citizens Day" for Marquette County.

There being no further business to come before the Board, it was moved by Commissioner Dompierre, supported by Commissioner Lawry, and carried, that the Marquette County Board of Commissioners adjourn until the next regular meeting.

It was moved by Commissioner Jenkin, supported by Commissioner DeJuliannie, and carried, that the matter be referred to the Budget & Executive Committee for study and report at the next regular meeting of the County Board.

A communication from the County Extension Director, Melvin Nyquist, regarding a solid waste management conference scheduled to be held June 29, 1972, in Marquette, Michigan, at Northern Michigan University, was read. Moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner DeJuliannie, that the Marquette County Extension Agent, Melvin Nyquist, and a representative of the Marquette County Health Department be asked to attend the meeting and report back to the Budget & Executive Committee with their report.

A resolution from the Marquette County Over-All Economic Development Planning Committee regarding the Tilden Mine project was read and ordered placed on file.

A letter from Mr. John M. Hongisto regarding problems being created by the Bancroft Dairy dumping wastes into the Dead River was read. It was moved by Commissioner DeJuliannie, supported by Commissioner Armatti, and unanimously carried, that the matter be referred to the County Health Department with a recommendation that action be taken at once.

A communication from the Marquette County Planning Commission regarding the exploration of water supplies in the western part of the County was read. It was moved by Commissioner Sodergren, supported by Commissioner Russo, and carried, that the matter be referred to the Department of Public Works.

A communication from Michigan Upper Peninsula Travel and Recreational Association regarding their Board meeting to be held June 27, 1972, at the Holiday Inn was read. It was moved by Commissioner Dompierre, supported by Commissioner Jacobson, that the Board Chairman, Carl V. Pellonpaa, be authorized to appoint two Board members to attend this meeting.

A communication from the Department of Treasury regarding a school of accounting being held at Michigan State University August 7-11 to acquaint County Controllers and County Clerks with the system of accounting approved by the State of Michigan was read. It was moved by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, and supported by Commissioner Goldsworthy, that the matter be referred to the Budget & Executive Committee for study and report.

A communication from the Cleveland-Cliffs Iron Co. regarding a request by the County Board of Commissioners about air pollution in the Eagle Mills area was read and placed on file. It was noted that the Cleveland-Cliffs Iron Co. is redesigning their whole dust eliminator process and all work on this would be done by the fall of the year 1972.

A communication from the Bodenus Limousine Service regarding its discontinuance of passenger service from the Marquette County Airport to Marquette effective Sept. 15, 1972, and their increase in rates to the amount of \$2.25 per person from the Marquette County Airport to Marquette effective June 15th until Sept. 15th was read and, on a motion by Commissioner Hammerschmidt, supported by Commissioner Jenkin, was referred to the Budget & Executive Committee for study and report.

At this point Chairman Carl V. Pellonpaa declared nominations open for appointment of a person to serve on the Marquette

County Library Board replacing Mrs. Edmund Thomas, who had asked not to be reappointed. Commissioner DeJuliannie nominated Mrs. Lois Miron to serve in this position. There being no further nominations, it was moved by Commissioner Clayton Anderson, supported by Commissioner Jacobson, and unanimously carried, that the nominations be closed and a unanimous ballot be cast for Mrs. Lois Miron.

A communication from the Board of County Road Commissioners regarding the transferring of \$30,000 from the Forestry Commission funds to the Marquette County Road Commission for the specific purpose of constructing a maintenance garage in Wells Twp. to store new equipment, was read. It was moved by Commissioners Goldsworthy, supported by Commissioner Krook, and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that the Board concur with the recommendation and transfer \$30,000 from the Forestry Commission funds to the Road Commission account for the purpose outlined herein.

A communication from the Department of State Police Director, John R. Plants, regarding the centralization of a communications system for Marquette County was read and ordered placed on file.

A communication from the U.P. Regional Intra Agency Committee on Mental Retardation regarding a conference to be held in Escanaba on June 29, 1972, was read. It was moved by Commissioner DeJuliannie, supported by Commissioner Goldsworthy, and carried, that the matter be referred to the Act 54 Board with a request that they send someone to attend this meeting and report back to the County Board of Commissioners.

A communication from the Michigan Centennial Homecoming Committee, Mr. Wendelin Perry, regarding an ad in the Centennial booklet was read. It was moved by Commissioner Clayton Anderson, supported by Commissioner Russo, and carried by a roll call vote, that the Marquette County Board of Commissioners buy a half page ad for both Michigan Twp. and Richmond Twp. Centennial as they have done in the past for Republic Twp. when they held their centennial. The following ayes and nays were recorded. All Commissioners voting aye with the exception of Commissioners Hammerschmidt, Jernstad and Sodergren.

Monthly reports of the Marquette County Health Dept., Marquette Road Commission, Community Health Center, Acocks Medical Facility, Controller and Treasurer were read and ordered placed on file and the Treasurer's report published.

Commissioner Sodergren addressed the Commission regarding what would be done to make sure that County Road 478 would be built to standards necessary for all county roads. He was assured by Mr. Robert DeGabriele that County Road 478 would be built to standards and all costs to provide this road would be paid for by the Tilden Mining Co.

It was moved by Commissioner DeJuliannie, supported by Commissioner Armatti, and unanimously carried by a roll call vote, that the application to construct the earthen dam and causeway on the Middle Branch of the Escanaba River in Section 27, Town 47 North, Range 28 West, and create a water reservoir be approved and the necessary permission for immediate construction be granted.

Gentlemen:

Your Budget and Executive Committee has had under consideration the various salaries on the County payroll. We, therefore, make the following recommendations for salaries of the several County Elective and Appointive Officers, Deputies, Clerks, Secretaries, etc., in the various departments, effective as of January 1, 1973, for the period up to and including December 31, 1973.

The salary schedule for employees listed herein is intended to apply to fully-trained personnel employed by the County of Marquette for a period of one year or more. New employees are to be employed at a starting salary of 90% of the salary fixed for the employee's position in this schedule and a one year probationary-training period shall follow employment. During the probationary-training period, the department head may make such adjustments to the employee's salary as the degree of training and competency of the employee warrants, but not to exceed the salary fixed for the position involved.

It is to be understood that all fees received by the County Clerk, County Treasurer, Sheriff, Register of Deeds and Judge of Probate be turned over to the County Treasurer on the last day of each month for deposit in the proper county funds, excepting, however, that fees for civil process, not payable from county funds, served on off time in private cars by the Sheriff or his deputies may be retained by the serving officer.

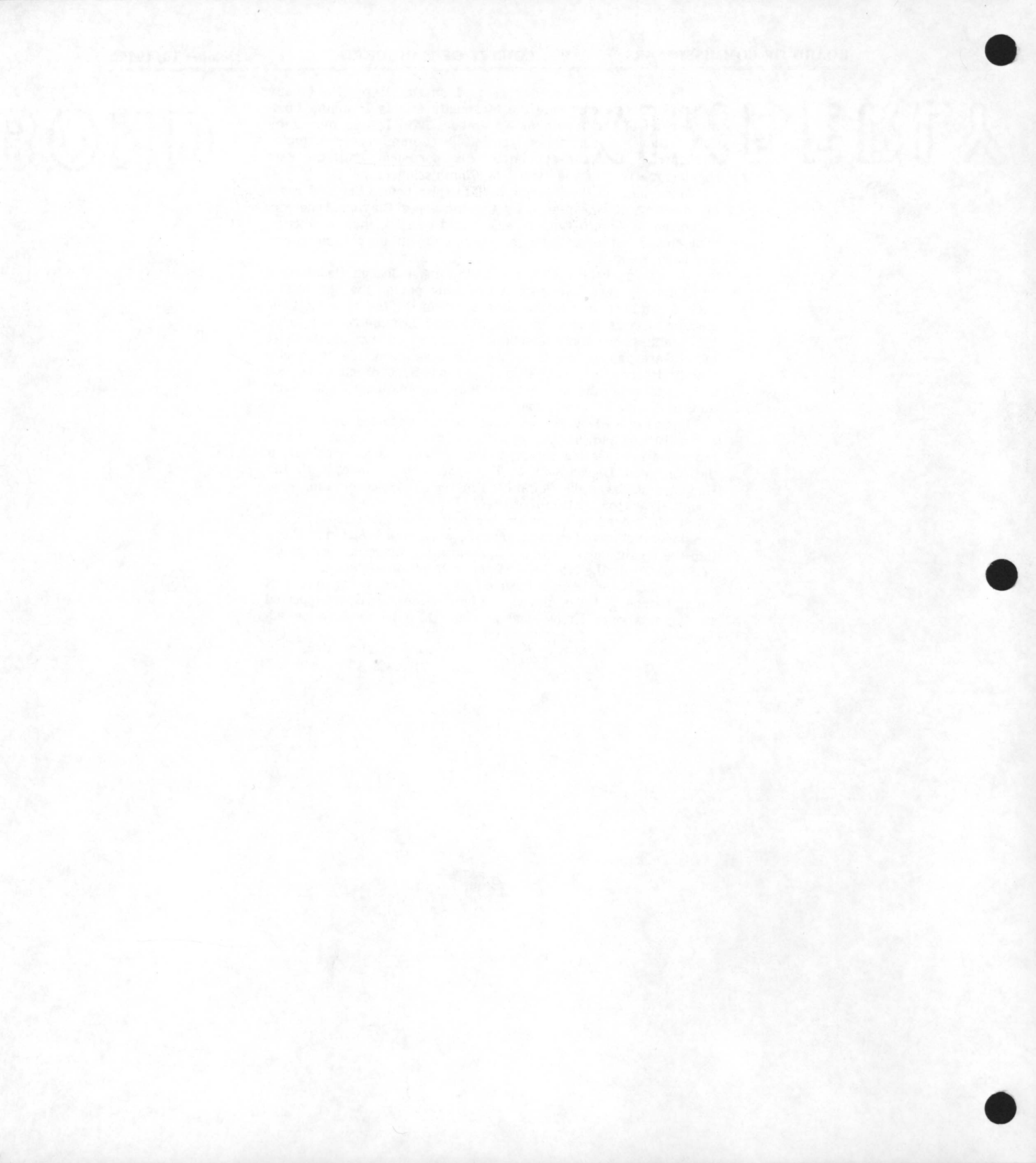

Racine, who has been elected to take office January 1, 1973, from this same district, be authorized to fill the vacancy. The Board thanked Mr. DeJuliannie for his efforts as County Commissioner. It was moved by Commissioner Sodergren, supported by Commissioner Russo, and carried, that the Board appoint Joseph O. Racine to fill this vacancy.

It was moved by Commissioner Morrison, supported by Commissioner Krook, and carried, that the Board dispense with the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting.

A communication from Probate Judge, Michael DeFant, regarding the appointment of Dr. Robert E. White as Deputy County Psychiatrist, was read. 9. That an Advisory Committee for the Court House Annex and Jail Construction Project be named, consisting of former County-City Building Authority members William Tonkin, Thomas McNabb and Robert DeRoche, together with Thomas Jernstad, present Chairman of the Building, Grounds and Insurance Committee.
