RAPS 'WEAK-KNEED' POLICY OF WILSON

Bozette City, Sept. 1.—"There is no war party worthy of the name in the United States," declared United States Senator Charles E. Townsend, of Jackson, at the annual banquet of the Charlevoix County Republican club at the Wolverine hotel here. "Congress and not the president declares war. The only real danger of our becoming involved in the European war is the administration's weak-kneed policy that essays to strut in ultimatum."

"The administration is writing and talking, too much. It has taken unknown, untried men into its councils, but has ignored congress entirely. "Even the senators and representatives on the foreign relations committees have been ignored completely. The members of the cabinet, with two or three exceptions are trying hard to make capital out of the European war and the people are expected to make foreign relations instead of domestic relations the issue in the next campaign. The time for publicity has come. Frank and honest discussion is now in order."

"The Mexican policy of the United States is the blackest page in the history in American diplomacy. Mexico's present distress is due to the prejudiced meddling of this country."

SAY GERMANS TO 'SIT TIGHT' ON LINE

Geneva, Switzerland, Sept. 1.—The Journal DeGeneve states that Germany has prepared no one but two strong lines of defense from the North Sea to Switzerland. From the same source come the affirmation that after consolidating its position around Warsaw, the Germans will entrench all along the Russian front and wait for peace in most favorable conditions. According to this authority, von Hindenburg's plan does not involve a pursuit of the Russian army beyond the line required to rectify the front east of Warsaw.

SOCIALISTS PLAN TO FOUND TOWN

Kansas City, Mo., Sept. 1.—Missouri is to have a new town—a town where everybody works and nobody is poor; a town, without political or business bosses; yet a town of law and order, and what is the principal thing—happiness.

This is the plan of Kansas City Socialists and according to Harry Chilton of this city, one of the leading organizers, the plan has grown to be considerably more than a plan for things have already progressed so far that half a dozen committees are now traveling over the state looking for a town site.

"The idea," Mr. Chilton said today, "is to buy about 12,000 or 15,000 acres adjacent to railroad and water facilities and divide it up into tracts to be farmed by members of the organization and their families. Each purchaser will own his land outright, except that a certain portion of all the timber and minerals on the land will belong to the whole community. We will build a public warehouse for the benefit of the whole colony. Every man will be required to do a certain amount of work for the town. There will be no hired help and no town officials. The organization is non-sectarian and non-political. While the movement was started by socialists we have members of all political parties."

TIMES WRITER ATTACKS DIRECTION OF CAMPAIGN

London, Sept. 1.—The Times' military correspondent this morning makes a strong attack on the higher direction of the campaign from the British side, which he declares is the subject of severe criticism in the fighting services.

Pointing to the "untoward fiasco," "the Dardanelles mistakes," and the failure to organize a munitions supply the correspondent says the cabinet has shown no genius for war.

"To put it brutally," the correspondent says, "we have not been governed in a strategic sense. We have merely drifted."

GERMAN PAPERS REPLY TO GREY

Berlin, by Wireless to Sayville, N. Y., Sept. 1.—The North German Gazette publishes an official reply to the recent statement by Sir Edward Grey, the British secretary for foreign affairs, with relation to the speech of Chancellor von Bethmann-Holweg at the reichstag. The Overseas News Agency today summarizes the reply in the Gazette as follows:

"The article points out that the discussion of all eventualities by British and Belgian military officers must have been reported to the British cabinet. Documents found in Brussels, it is asserted, show conclusively that a British military attache coolly told his Belgian colleague that Great Britain would land troops in Belgium with out Belgium's consent and that Belgium never had protested against this having decided not to resist a British violation of Belgian neutrality; but that upon the mere supposition that a German invasion was possible, the Belgian government prepared complete plans for cooperation with British forces. Such a country, it is declared is not a neutral country."

The Overseas News Agency in concluding the summary of the North German Gazette's reply says:

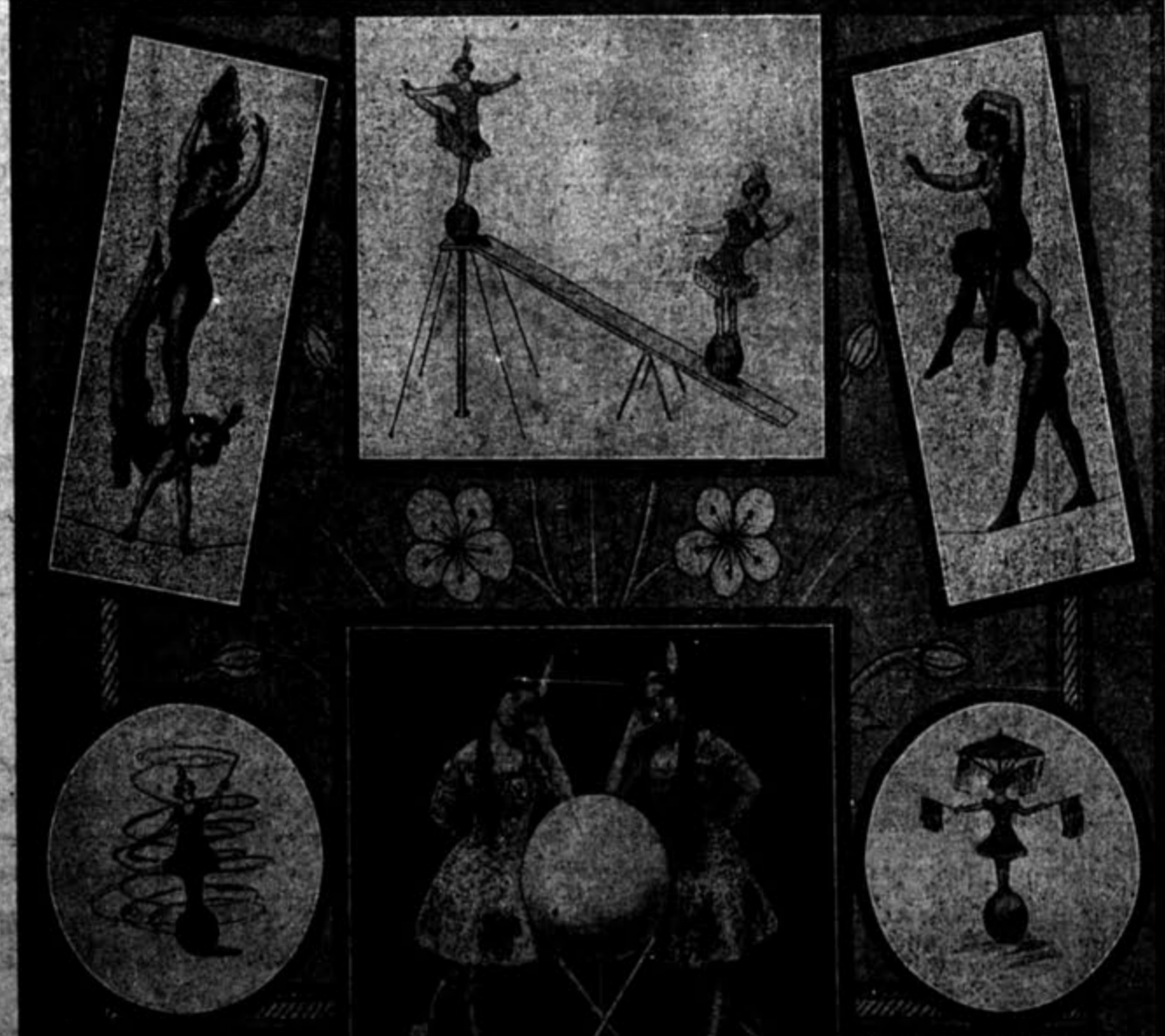
"If Germany had quietly looked on while Russia gathered her millions of soldiers at the frontier, Germany today would look as East Prussia did after the Russian invasion, and Sir Edward Grey himself had read the report of the British ambassador at St. Petersburg that Russian mobilization must lead to German mobilization and war. "Germany fight not for supremacy as Sir Edward said, but for the liberation of Europe from the brutal supremacy that England had maintained over it by her powerful fleet and with her policy of dividing the European powers into hostile parts hacking at each other in the interests of Great Britain and permitting that nation to throw her weight where it best suited her egotistic ambition."

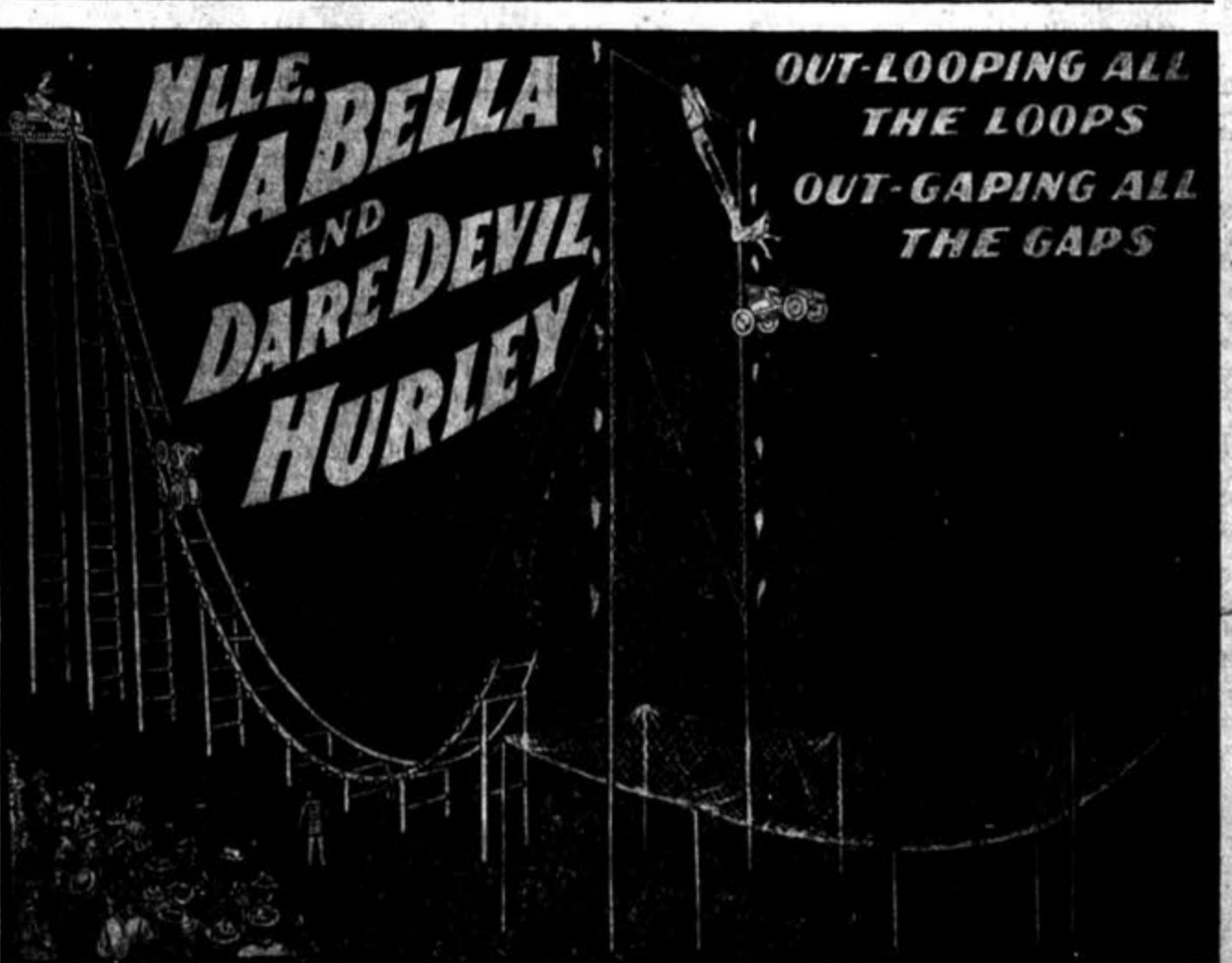
