RE: Financial Status of the Nishnawbe News

This will confirm the recent meeting and discussion that we had regarding the Nishnawbe News budget. What undoubtedly caused the major setback in the present budget was the fact that there were \$3,136 worth of bills from last year that were carried over and deducted from the present budget.

As we review the situation it looks to me as though we will not have funds available to go beyond the present issue which is being drawn up for printing. At that I have a great concern for the \$1,760 rental fee which is due for the present year.

I was pleased to learn that serious efforts will be made to contact the various agencies for financial support and that there still is a slight possibility that some money might be forthcoming from the Lutheran organization. I hope too that the 8,000 subscribers made up of individuals and organizations will realize that a monetary contribution is critically needed. There is always a possibility to hope for some support from advertisers or from individuals who want to make a special contribution.

In any case I'm sure that the seriousness of the financial situation is something that none of us can overlook. I sincerely hope that efforts to get support from the readers will be forthcoming.
