THE "DUNKERS." Their Faith and Practice, Mode of Worship and Penitentials.

Myerstown, a pleasant village of 1,300 inhabitants in the Lebanon valley of Pennsylvania, is just now a point of some interest as the place chosen for the meeting of the annual national conference of the religious society properly denominated "German Baptists," but better known by the name of "Dunkers."

There are few published accounts of the origin and history of the denomination, but the present organization undoubtedly dates from the religious movement of Alexander Mack, in Germany, in 1708. Mack, with seven others, undertook the study of the bible for the purpose of forming an opinion of its teachings.

The number of churches cannot be much less than 500. There are certainly from 1,500 to 2,000 ministers and elders, while the membership is about 100,000. There are single churches having as many as 600 members.

The term Dunkers did not originate among themselves, nor did they use it, although they do not particularly object to it. It is a slight corruption of a German word meaning "to dip," and is expressive of one of their important ordinances.

The Dunkers have many peculiarities which they strictly observe. It is to some extent their intention to be a "peculiar people," believing it both a privilege and a duty. They are non-resistant, and will not bear arms under any circumstances.

The prevailing style of dress among them is somewhat similar to that of the Friends, but variations have crept in more among the brethren than the sisters. There is no positive rule as to style or color of the fundamental principle being that of entire plainness and abstention from useless ornament.
