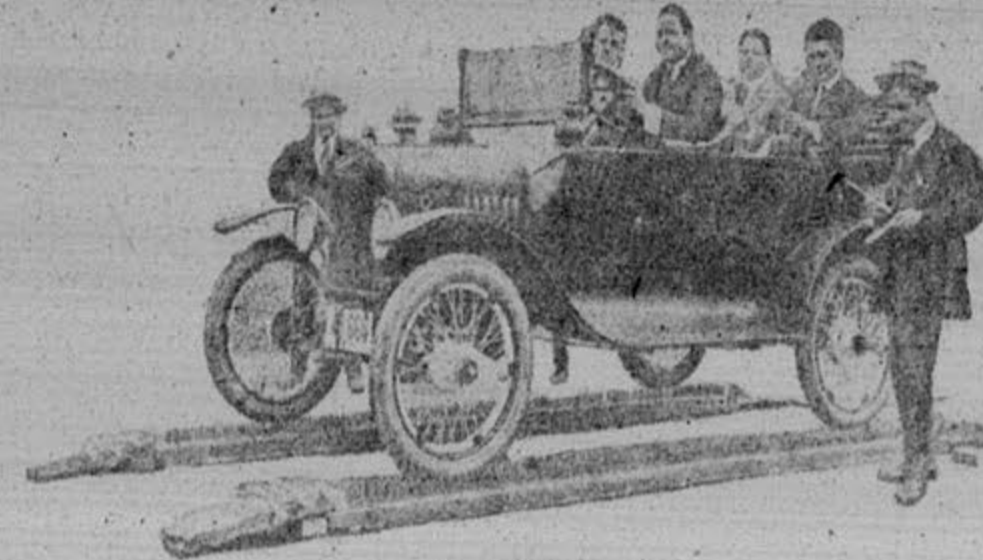

Plant Diseases Costly. Millions of bushels of grain, fruit and vegetables and a big tonnage of cotton were lost to American farmers last year by plant diseases, according to figures compiled by the plant disease survey of the Department of Agriculture. The survey said that the statistics indicate that loss of prompt application of modern measures of control was largely the cause of the loss. The plant disease survey estimated the losses at 112,000,000 bushels of wheat, 222,000,000 bushels of corn, 50,000,000 bushels of oats, 1,000,000 bushels of sweet potatoes, 15,000,000 bushels of sweet potatoes, 15,000,000 bushels of apples, 10,000,000 bushels of peaches and 10,000,000 bushels of apples.
