NORTHWEST IN GRIP OF SEVERE BLIZZARD

ESCANABA STILL IN GRIP OF STORM AND RAILROADS GIVE UP

Escanaba Traction Company Operates Cars and Is Only City in Peninsula So Served.

Continuing without abatement, the storm which started Tuesday night and Wednesday and still today, with the exception of a brief respite today, is a tough with the outside world.

Not a train entered or left Escanaba after 11 o'clock this morning when the Chicago train due at 9:50 the night before came limping in. Train 117 was not up here and nothing has gone north since 7 o'clock yesterday morning.

Crew of Shovelers. Train 119 came down from Alpena by last night about seven o'clock and brought along a crew of about 15 shovelers who got off here. This train started south but was stuck at Marquette and that was the end of the line for the Northwest and such a thing as shovelers can be expected with some degree of accuracy.

The Escanaba and Lake Superior Railway is receiving around 100 cars a day but more up the example of this morning after a train started from Wolf Lake and arrived before reaching Escanaba. Efforts were centered on getting this train back to Wolf and the 6:30 A. M. was then prepared to start it.

A St. Paul train composed of two engines and two coaches was stalled three miles east of Iron River. It was reported this morning.

No Delivery Service. Local street cars, operated by the Escanaba Traction Company and Michigan Northern suspended delivery and it is possible to get thru the morning delivery.

The one bright spot in the picture of the situation is the fact that the traction company was still operating yesterday afternoon. The effort to fight the storm is being made and much are available in use of the city and this afternoon. If it looks all the time and things in town will get them. The situation is bad and getting worse, but we want to see if we can't lick this thing in a fair fight.

Make Gallant Fight. To the credit of the Escanaba Traction Company it may be said that it has gone further, fought harder and made a more gallant effort to render public service than any town in Northern Michigan, where every street car line is shut up except at Escanaba.

Mail deliveries today were confined to Ludington street almost exclusively. The condition of all streets being such that mailmen could not make any delivery with delivery.

Billy Cross came down to work on snow shovels and it is reported that a local physician last night adopted the method of reaching the home of one of his patients.

The best advice available indicates that it is simply a waiting game. Snow shovellers will be needed. It will be a great opportunity for men to get some of the work for which they have been seeking. Crews to Clear the Streets After Big Storm Has Abated. No efforts are being made by the street commissioner and his crew to clear the streets and sidewalks of the city. The work of the undertaker is impossible with the storm still raging. Several requests have been made at the city clerk's office for men to do this work.

The work if undertaken at the present time would be of no avail. The places shovelled fill up as fast as they are cleared. However following the storm a large crew of men will be at work clearing the streets and sidewalks that the city might once more resume its traffic.

1920 WAS LOW YEAR FOR U. S. FARMERS STATISTICS SHOW

Claimed to Have Made Less Tow Years Ago Than Any Year in the Last Ten.

NEW YORK, Feb. 23. The American farmer, who rose to unprecedented heights of prosperity in 1918 and 1919, earned less in 1920 than he had earned in any year of the last ten years, according to statistics published today by the National Bureau of Economic Research.

Reduced actual dollars paid to him in 1920, the farmer's income is shown by the report, was less than in the three previous years, but was greater than in the seven years from 1910 to 1916, inclusive.

The figures taken from a detailed report of an exhaustive nationwide survey show that the country's 6,400,000 farmers in 1920 earned approximately \$1,200,000,000, a drop of \$1,000,000,000 from their income for the year before.

The farmers who represent about 10 percent of the gainfully employed, have received during the past decade a share in the total national income varying between 12.5 percent in 1911 and 14.1 percent in 1918, 1919, 1920, when it dropped to 14.0 percent.

The final figures for the total income in 1920 can only be approximately owing to the delay in publishing the income tax returns.
