How does physical culture cultivate or strengthen?

Violent exercise, especially when one is unaccustomed to it, exercises one, even proved fatal by rupture of blood vessels or by over-ventilation of the heart. Moderate exercise strengthens. It carries more blood to the heart, the blood during the exercise is purified, and carries more oxygen, this means more rapid tissue oxidation, combustion, as doctors say, tissue metabolism, meaning tissue change.

Hence it is becoming of special importance that the training of children should be so carried on as not only to fit them mentally for the struggle of modern life, but also to make them physically fit to bear its excessive wear and tear.
