Sickle's is rather funny. Daniel F. Sickle is rather funny. Sickle himself. Last year he out-heroled Crocker in his abuse of Mr. Cleveland up to the time of the congressional nominations in New York, when Sickle's heavy support of the Democratic ticket was secured by the placing of his own name on it as a Democratic candidate for congress. Sickle was elected to congress, and is a meek and lowly follower of the administration: just like Crocker.

But Gen. Sickle seems to be holding his seat in congress in violation of the article of the federal constitution, which says that "no person holding an office under the United States shall be a member of either house during his continuance in such office." Gen. Sickle is an officer on the retired list of the United States Army, with the rank of major-general and a regular annual salary of \$5,925. The question has been raised as to whether he is entitled to this salary while a member of congress, but there would seem to be no question about that at all. It is the office and pay of representative in congress that he is not entitled to, if the constitution is to govern in his case. He has no right to a seat in congress if he is holding any other office under the United States, and he is still holding another office under the United States, and unquestionably is entitled to receive his salary as an army officer on the retired list, the same as though he had never been a candidate for congress.

There is no partisan gain or loss involved in the matter. It is simply a question as to whether it is worth while to let a little constitutional prohibition stand in the way of gratifying personal desire.—Detroit Journal.

A Glut of Money.
The financial stringency is over. The New York banks are receiving so much currency from the banks of the interior that they don't know what to do with it. Their vaults are full of idle funds. It is a question what to do with this accumulating volume of money. The First National bank of that city has already withdrawn half a million of the government bonds, deposited in the Treasury to secure circulation, surrendering that amount of its bank-notes, and other national banks will probably follow.

The reason of this over-supply of funds is easy to understand. The scare is over, and the enormous sums which were hoarded by timid depositors have been re-deposited. But business has not recovered as quickly as did finance. There would have been millions of dollars used in building this season, but the pinch not abandoned. It is too late in the season to begin extensive operations. Then the industrial world has shortened sail, awaiting the tariff tinkering of the Democratic Congress; the wholesalers and retailers have followed suit, and as a consequence they do not need the extensive loans they would ordinarily require. The banks of the interior thus find less than the usual demand for money, and send their idle funds to New York for investment.

This state of things proves clearly that there is plenty of money in the country. Any man who has anything of value to sell can get the money for it. If he can not sell it, it is because there is no demand for the article, whatever it may be—not because there is not money enough. The men who are shouting for "more money" are those who either have nothing to sell which anybody wants, or because they can not give good security for loans.—Toledo Blade.
