ATTEMPTED TO KILL LABOR

ASSISTANT COUNSEL FOR DREYFUS SHOT AT RENNES MONDAY.

Would Be Assassin's Bullet Struck Victim in the Back.

At 6 o'clock Monday morning at Rennes, France, a well-nigh successful attempt was made to kill M. Labori who defended Zola last year and who was at Rennes as assistant counsel for Dreyfus. The shooting occurred while Labori and two friends were walking toward the court and near Quay Richemond. The would-be assassin, dressed as a laborer, stepped from behind a high board fence and shot the bullet entering Labori's back at the sixth vertebra behind the thorax. Military surgeons were sent for and responded to the call. The victim was placed in an ambulance and taken to his temporary residence not far distant.

Detachments of troops and gendarmes were sent out at once to scour the country in the vicinity of the would be assassin.

The attempt made upon the life of Labori was evidently the result of a plot, and for the reason of his connection with the famous Dreyfus case.

Labori's physicians state that the unfortunate lawyer is improving and that it is believed that he will live. The would-be assassin has not been captured.
