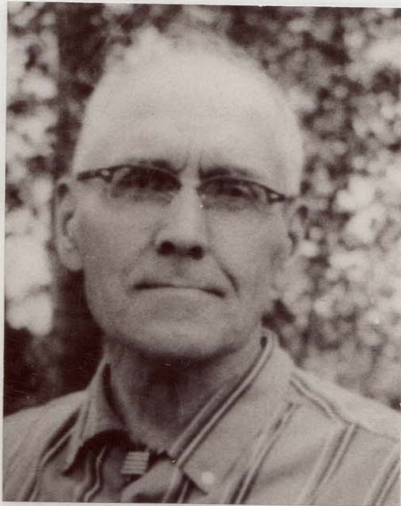

## William Gamache Dies In Hawaii

William Gamache, 71, of 1314 Minnesota Ave., Gladstone died at 9 p. m. Sunday at St. Francis Hospital in Honolulu, Hawaii where he had been vacationing with his wife since Nov. 24. He had been a patient at the hospital there since Dec. 25.

Mr. Gamache was born in Champion Dec. 2, 1888, and moved to Hermansville as a child. He married the former Eva Carriere Oct. 4, 1910. The couple moved to Gladstone in 1919 and had resided there since.
