At 11:11⁰⁰ 11⁴⁵ Proclamation was given that Poles would close at 2 o'clock for one hour at 12 o'clock m. The Poles closed for 1 hour the keys were given to George Williams and seal to Millard Duell.

Poles were opened at one p. m. and voting commenced. Annual Report by W. A. Hughes, Town Clerk and approved. The following Resolution was offered: Resolved that a Highway Labor Tax of one quarter of one percent be levied upon the taxable property of the Township of Thompson for the year, 1903. Resolution offered by H. D. Harris supported by Fred Miller. An amendment was offered by M. Duell supported by Louis Miller that we raise one half of one percent voting was by Division of House Amendment lost and Original motion carried.

Resolved that we raise fifteen hundred dollars on the taxable property of the Township for Bridge purposes in said Township offered by M. Duell supported by Patrick Quinlin an amendment was offered by Jas. B. F. Acker supported by Wm. Casey that we divide the House amendment carried and Original motion was lost.
