Dear Brother I received your letter a few days ago which found me all well excepting sore feet and marching, along we have had good many fights since we left Pulaski and have lost several thousand men but we make them run we are following them up but there is a good many soldiers that have gone to their last sleep it looks horrid to see so many of them mangled up but we have got to whip or get whipt but our boys keeps up good spirits thinking

the war is now going
on with a rush and
we will all be home
that is alive at christ
mas to greet you so prep
are something good for
charley and me for we
shall be nothing but sc
arcrows we shall be so
poor for we have had
fare now I can tell you
direct your letters to
patterson that is our
head quarters 16th Army
corps for there is more
than one corps in this
army than all will be
wright you spoke about
that money that goddin
ton has he is ablidged
to pay the money and
intrust as the note reads
so I cant see the use

of doing anything about
it untill the time ex
pires any way let it rest
for the present I have
not been payed of since
january I think we have
got to take atlanta Ica
before we are payed
of than you will get
some money on that note
all I want is to keep my
two littles girls clothes
up well the rest you
can have untill the note
is payed I wished Ella
had a few more clothes
than all would be wright
how is farther's health
now B F Burr yestaday
and O Brisco they was
real glad to see me
I hope you will have some
tomatoe jelly made this summer

if I can get any flower
seeds I will send you some
now good Bye
