Dear Brother I have now
got to my Regt we have got
a good camping ground behind
the Rebel Breastworks I would
like to give you a description
of Shermans raid after the
rips and the tearing up of
the track on the Macon and
Montgomery Railroad but as
my letter is of buisness you
must excuse me this time
I will get a power of attour-
ney made out this week to send
d in this letter you will find
the note and Mortgage in
my top drawer in my count
Book if when this letter reach
es you if you have not
made any bargain to loan

my money out of think it
will be better to put my
money in the United States
Seven Thirty Loan and take
the Coupons, Treasury notes for
three years, I was looking over
the Ogle County Reporter and
I saw the notice and I think
that the safest thing I can do
I would like to put in two
hundred dollars in two notes
to my name and my heirs
in case I should be pit of
By Debs my children could
draw it and I will pay you
for your trouble if the money
has to be sent to Chicago to
invest perhaps you may know
one of some trusty man that
is going to Chicago that could
do the business the interest
must be paid from the fi
fteenth of August to the

time the money is put in
to the Bank I believe the money
is due from Coddington the
eight of Oct the note two hun
dred and fifty the interest 25
dollars \$275.00 the note you ha
ve against me is \$61.47cts
and about eight months inter
est due on it will make
about \$66.50cts and about five
dollars you had credit to me
on your book when I came
away, and take money enough
out of that you draw from
Coddington and then take up
the note you have against me
and what is left except the
two hundred dollars is
to be sent to Josephine &
Ella as soon as you can
to get them some clothes
and as soon as you get this
business done for me let

me know I dont know when I shall
draw my pay from government
but I hope soon I have not
received any letter from you
for sometime I saw George
Richardson a few days ago
he has gone to his Regiment
to be mustered out I will
finish this letter as soon as
I get my other papers made
out Sept 17 64 I have
now got my papers fixt and
will send to day this thing
again, if thair is know agent
in Dixon thare may be some
one going to Chicago that you
may trust with the money
to do the business as I have
fixt up as soon as you get
this thing fixt let me know
I have not time to write any
more so I will have to close
from your Brother
