Dear Brother I received a letter from you yesterday that a few hours after I sent the last letter to you you mentioned about loaning my money to Stiles + Kuykton. I dont think it will be so good a plan as it will to loan it to government than I shall be more safe and larger interest so I had rather you would do as I requested we are expecting to draw our money from government the first of next week and then I will have some more money to put out at interest. Lieut. Sarty of my company has sent in his

resignation and I shall send
by him if he goes home
then have it express to Dix
and I want you to send one
quire of good letter paper and
some envelopes and a few
stamps by mail you can let
the post master see the thing
and then it will come
the same as newspapers,
there is some talk of the
soldiers of Ill & Indiana co-
ming home to vote it would
be a good thing for old
Abe if we should, we wo-
uld soon turn the scale
in them two states for the
soldiers in the west are
all secession men but I
fear there is know such
good news for us all other
soldiers in the field can
vote where they are

I have heard that Gen
gates has wrote to washing-
ton to see if the thing can
be done if we should come
up the copperheads wont have
it all there own way if we
cant come the quicker we
start on another campaign the
better for our country for old
Sherman will the next time
drive them to the Gulf and
wind up the rebellion before
the sneaking copperheads and
peace men can get in to
power for this Election is a
going to depend on the ~~soldiers~~
soldiers vote if they can
all vote old Abe is sure
of a large majority which
