The shipments of iron from this district still goes on with unabated vigor, and the close of the season will show a handsome output.

Hos. Ed. Breitung is soon to put a Bullock diamond drill to work on his property on the Penoka iron range.

The Cleveland company is doing splendidly in the matter of ore shipments the present season, having shipped up to and including Wednesday, the 18th inst., 110,019 tons.

The diamond drill being operated on the old Lane fall grounds by the Lake Superior Iron company is again working in snappy work after having penetrated 40 feet 7 inches of first-class ore.

At the Winthrop hematite mine work is progressing steadily and the mine is looking better than at any time since its opening.

During the past week the Republic mine turned its 150,000 tons, having shipped from the opening of navigation up to Wednesday last, the date to which our tables are made up, 152,300 gross tons of iron ore.

The new engine house at the Cleveland mine is now entirely completed and the entire machinery plant, one of the finest in the region, is in place and being installed by the miners.

BOY'S SCATTERED OBELISKS.—Thirty obelisks transported from Egypt from time to time are now standing in various parts of Europe. Of these there are in Rome eleven, of which four are higher than the obelisk of Luxor. The highest of these, and the highest base, stands before the church of St. John Lateran. The obelisk in the piazza of St. Peter's is 62 feet 9 inches high. Both of these were mounted on high pedestals. The pedestals of the St. John Lateran obelisk is 44 feet high, making the entire height of obelisk and pedestal 150 feet. The pedestal of the St. Peter's obelisk is a trifle less than 50 feet high, making the whole height of the monument 132 feet 2 inches high. If Connaught Square has brought with him the entire pedestal on which the New York obelisk stood at Alexandria, about the same proportions will be observed as those of the St. John Lateran obelisk, the pedestal of the former being 27 feet 1 inch and its obelisk 68 feet 11 inches, making the whole height of our obelisk 96 feet.
