

Ontonagon Trims Trout Creek 10-3

Rain Forces Play in All but 2 Loop Tilts

Playing before a record season crowd that braved an all afternoon drizzle, Trout Creek suffered a complete breakdown yesterday to absorb a 10-3 trimming at the hands of Ontonagon.

Only two games went into the records during the day as rain and wet grounds forced cancellation of six other Interstate league contests. Marenisco nosed out Bruce Crossing 5-4 in the other loop tilt.

At Glidden, a downpour broke up the Saxon-Glidden fray in the second frame after Glidden took a 1-0 lead on R. Hart's first inning homer. Ramsay had a 1-0 advantage at Bergland when the game was called in the fourth because of rain.

All other eastern and western circuit contests were called off prior to game time.

Ontonagon scored nine unearned runs on 12 Trout Creek errors as the leaders suffered their first defeat of the season. Green, on the mound for the victors, held the host team to five hits, while his mates touched two Trout Creek twirlers for 10.

olewski graduated from the Lu-
ther L. Wright high school, sub-
sequently completing the two
years course at Gogebic Junior
college in June preceding his in-
duction in October, 1942.
