The following is the annual account of the commissioners of

There was no labor tax assessed in the year 1882 and the
amount of poll tax labor actually performed as by Comptroller's
report is eleven days. And the amount of commission paid
by the same report was twenty three dollars which said \$23⁰⁰
together with forty dollars which I drew from the treasury
per order No 2 for the purpose has been expended in opening a
road from Delta Lumber Co. Dock west to Dausay road.

The improvements which have been made on roads and bridges
in said township of Thompson during the preceding year are as follows:

1st The completion of a bridge and part of a road on Lake Shore
Road near Millard Quells place known as Oldner Job

2nd The grubbing and grading of Lake Shore Road from Millard
Quells place to Point aux Barques.

3rd The completion of Lake Shore Road from Thompson to Manistique

4th The construction of the road from Delta Lumber Co. Dock

to the Dausay Road.

5th The building of a small Bridge on Lake Shore Road
near John Starks place.

6th The letting of contracts for three Bridges on Lake Shore
Road south of Point aux Barques, which said Bridges have
partly been built and are to be completed by the first of
May 1883 with promise to extend time for building, if asked
for, provided the road to said Bridges be not opened
in the meantime.

7th The letting of contract for Manising and Manistique
Roads, which said road has been partly built, and opened
for winter use, and the time for finishing said contract has
been extended until May the 10th 1883.

Third, the opening of the Lake Shore road from Point aux Barques to the Delta County Line.

Many years of experience have shown that the state road by hard winters and deep snow is almost, and sometimes entirely impassible; on account of the many and heavy snow drifts, whereas: The Lakeshore road if opened, would be protected by the Woods from snow drifts, and the traveling public as well as the Mail stage would not have to be delayed or troubled on account of the snow; the bridges on said road as I stated before will be finished according to contract on the first of May next and it would be only necessary to open the road for travel.

I have also laid out several more roads, but the above are the most essential ones to be opened.

The expenses of making such improvements, beyond what the labor to be assessed this year will accomplish is estimated by me to be a great deal more than we can legally raise in one year, and I would therefore recommend the assessment of one half of one fr. ct. on the whole valuation of the township.

There is also due to the highway fund a certain amount on delinquent personal property tax of 1881 of which the Treasurer when collected is to give an account.

performed together with the moneys collected for construction and expended for labor is $542 \frac{5}{8}$ days, as appears by the returns made to me by the several overseers of highways of the township.

The improvements made by the above labor have been in repairing the Lake Shore Road from Bark Point to Thompson also from Thompson to State road, and on John Stark road.

The condition of said roads are at present but passable, and require further repairs and I would here state and advise that the road from Thompson to Mamistique be saro-dusted with at least one foot of saw dust on account of the soft sand which makes it hard for drawing of loads, and as it will be hereafter the most needed and traveled road upon which the stages with the Mail passes.

To estimate the amount of highway labor which in my judgement should be assessed upon the taxable property of the township for the next ensuing year to be one half days labor upon each one hundred dollars of valuation for the year.

I have let by contract two road jobs viz:

One from Point aux Barques to Perrin Creek, and one from Thompson towards the nine Mile Lake, the cost of which I can at present not estimate, not knowing how much corduroy there is needed on them, but think that the two jobs will nearly exhaust our highway fund raised the last year.

The necessary improvements to be made in my opinion are as follows:

The extension of the road from David Hersh job to the nine Mile Lake; and also the opening of some roads in what is known as the Mitchell neighborhood and the expenses of making such improvements beyond what the labor to be assessed this year will accomplish is estimated by me at one half of one fr. ct. on the whole valuation of the township.




