MOW IT HAS GROWN IN PUBLIC FAVOR.

One of the Finest Printing Outfits on the Peninsula Just Received.

It is now a little over ten years ago that THE MANISTIQUE DEMOCRAT, then known as The News, was launched on the troubled sea of journalism. We are unacquainted with the earlier history of the paper; as all information concerning it was destroyed in the disastrous conflagration of a year ago last September which totally destroyed the plant. However, the News was first published by Bert Moran who, after a short time, was succeeded by Will F. Montgomery, who changed the name of the paper to the Sunday Sun. Under Montgomery's management the paper was not long in making a reputation. "It shines for all," was the old familiar motto of the Sun, but it's effulgent beams of light were oft-times more intolerable to bear than the vertical rays of the noonday sun to the wrongdoer or to the individual who unwisely antagonized the paper.

Always agressive and bitter as gall in its denunciations of everything it opposed the Sun did not attain that degree of success its talented publisher might have secured for it by adopting a more conservative course. The paper had a stormy career. The editor's health broke down and he was compelled to quit news paper work for a time.

Ed. Jones afterwards assumed control of the paper, changing the name back to the News, but he had charge of it for only a brief period, when the plant was purchased by Rev. T. J.
